I thank the parishioners of Our Saviour and Sacred Hearts for your generosity over the years – and especially for those who have remained consistent and generous supporters during the pandemic.

I am very pleased that we have begun to initiate and expand ministries at Our Saviour and Sacred Hearts – seniors, homeless, and young adults. They are at the beginning stage, but at least we are beginning. I am grateful for those who are participating and to those coordinating them.

Let me state the obvious: these ministries take resources to coordinate, carry out, and grow. I am grateful for the generous support of our parishioners in the multiple ways that we ask for that support throughout the year. Sometimes these can seem too much – regular and special parish collections each Sunday, the Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal, and the Renew and Rebuild Campaign. I also know that many of you are also generous to Catholic Charities. I mention these together because I realize we ask for your generosity in numerous ways – and that there needs to be a balance.

During the pandemic, some of these were put on a backburner – particularly the Annual Stewardship Appeal. In January, we will again be asking for your support of the Cardinal's Appeal 2022.

I want to extend an invitation to you to a special Mass for the Vigil of the Immaculate Conception on **Tuesday December 7 at 5:30 p.m.**, at the Chapel of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. 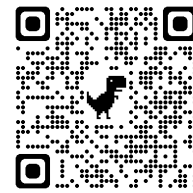
### Parish Registration

**Reflection:** The Church today is celebrating Our Lord Jesus Christ as King of the Universe. This Solemnity comes at the end of the liturgical year and sums up the mystery of Jesus “firstborn from the dead and ruler of the kings of the earth” (*Collect, Year B*), broadening our gaze towards the complete fulfillment of the Kingdom of God, when God will be everything to every one (*cf. 1 Cor 15:28*). St. Cyril of Jerusalem said: “We preach not one advent only of Christ, but a second also, far more glorious than the former. For the former gave a view of his patience; but the latter brings with it the crown of a divine kingdom... in his second, He comes attended by a host of Angels, receiving glory” (*Catechesis XVI, I, Illuminandum, De secundo Christi adventu: pg 33, 869 a*).

Jesus' entire mission consisted in proclaiming the Kingdom of God and putting it into practice among human beings with signs and miracles. However, as the Second Vatican Council recalls “this kingdom shone out before men ... in the presence of Christ” (Dogmatic Constitution *Lumen Gentium*, n. 5) and he established it through his death on the Cross and his Resurrection, with which he manifested himself as Lord and Messiah and Priest for ever.

This Kingdom of Christ has been entrusted to the Church which is its “seed” and its “beginning” and has the task of proclaiming it and spreading it among the peoples, with the power of the Holy Spirit (*cf. ibid.*). At the end of the established time, the Lord will consign the Kingdom to God the Father and will present to him all those who have lived in accordance with his commandment of love.
