At the Preparation of the Gifts, the choir sings a motet by Ukrainian priest, poet, and composer Ostap Nyzhankivsky. Our prayers are with Ukrainians everywhere at this dreadful time.

At the communion, the choir sings a motet by English Renaissance composer William Byrd. Working in a time fraught with conflict in England, Byrd maintained his Catholic faith at great risk. Ave Verum Corpus stems from his collection of Catholic music composed for clandestine masses celebrated in secret.
