On the 2nd Sunday of Lent, we hear the story of Christ's Transfiguration on the Mount. Our first hymn is a poetic paraphrase by the 19th c. hymn writer John Mason Neale. At the Preparation of the Gifts, the choir sings a motet by Ukrainian priest, poet, and composer Ostap Nyzhankivsky. Our prayers are with Ukrainians everywhere at this dreadful time.

At the communion, the choir sings a motet by English Renaissance composer William Byrd. Working in a time fraught with conflict in England, Byrd maintained his Catholic faith at great risk. *Ave Verum Corpus* stems from his collection of Catholic music composed for clandestine masses celebrated in secret.
