Thousands Seeking Protection in the United States from Violence and Persecution

Several parishioners have mentioned seeing interviews and other coverage of the work Catholic Charities is doing with the thousands of Venezuelan asylum seekers who have arrived in New York in the past two months. Of the approximately 6,000 who have arrived, Catholic Charities has received almost 2,000 at our offices. Most are fleeing violence and oppression in their own country and travelled over 3,000 miles on treacherous journeys through Colombia and Central America to seek protection in the United States. Most arrive with very little. If you might want to help you can follow this QR code to the "Amazon wish list" site and purchase items to help out a family with some basics. They will be delivered to Catholic Charities offices for distribution to the families. I have done this myself and the QR code works!


Profession of Faith


