Biblical Literature

Last Sunday I mentioned two books on the Bible in my homily. A few people asked for their names. The longer book is *A Marginal Jew: Rethinking the Historical Jesus* by John P. Meier, one of the preeminent scripture scholars who passed away last fall. While its length, style and language is not light, much of the text (not the footnotes) is accessible to a serious reader willing to make the effort. The title of the other book, *What's the Message: Bible Basics for Busy People* by me is self-explanatory. In a little over 100 pages the book gathers about 25 Bible passages that try to capture the basic narrative of the Bible. There is a brief reflection on each passage.

LITURGICAL UPDATE

On the first day of the week ... we gathered to break bread..., (Acts 20:7)

The COVID pandemic forced radical liturgical changes. Masses were cancelled in Spring 2020 for months. When we again celebrated Masses together in the summer of 2020, many liturgical practices were curtailed or altered for public health reasons. Gradually, here at Our Saviour, we have been returning to a “new normal.” Let me mention a few things – not all pandemic related. Mass attendance is about back to pre-pandemic levels with a salutary shift. Our congregation now includes a higher proportion of younger adults. We welcome people of all ages and are delighted by this. (Thanks to Fr. Enzo Del Brocco we have also begun a young professionals group after the 5 PM Mass.)

Our Choir is back with a few changes. Our new Liturgical Music Director, Buck McDaniel, in taking over from Paul Murray, had big shoes to fill. He has done so wonderfully and made some nice changes and additions. Our choir is back for the major liturgical seasons and they also sing at the 12 noon Mass at the Chapel. Cantors/Leaders of song are at all the Sunday Masses (except the 8 AM at the Chapel.) Parishioners are encouraged to sing.

Because of the death of Fr. Cornelius Chang last Fall the 3 PM Sunday Mass in Korean is no longer celebrated at the Chapel. However, we are pleased that members of the Korean Community have accepted our invitation to join the 12 noon Mass at the Chapel and gather afterwards downstairs.

Our already strong cohort of lectors has been augmented with new readers. We have begun to again have Eucharistic ministers and altar servers. We are planning to make this more regular shortly. Again we are pleased that we are adding new ministers to our existing ones. We are grateful to Virginia Hill for coordinating this.

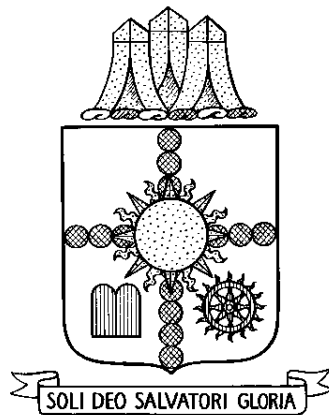
A number of people have commented that our ushers and greeters create a welcoming ambience at the door of the Church. While not part of the liturgy proper, this is very important to a worshipping faith community.

Two items that will wait longer: Communion under both species and re-filling holy water founts. We have continued to receive guidance from the Archdiocese to hold off on these. Regarding holy water – Feel free to bring your own bottle with plain water and any of the priests will be happy to bless it.

We are also trying to figure out how to re-start tolling the Church bells. One would think it would be easy, it is not. Tom Travers and Maria Rivera are working on this.

I am grateful for all those who add to our liturgical celebrations with their various ministries.

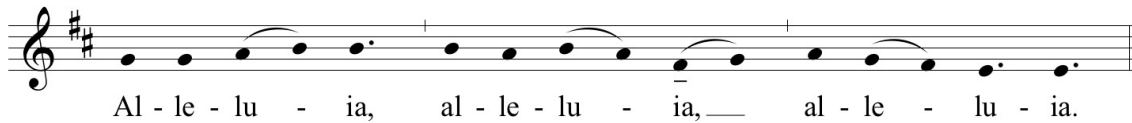

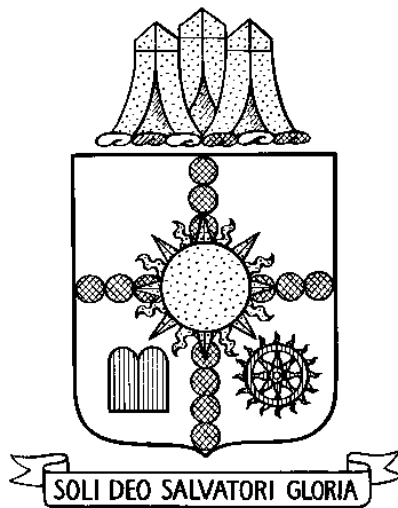

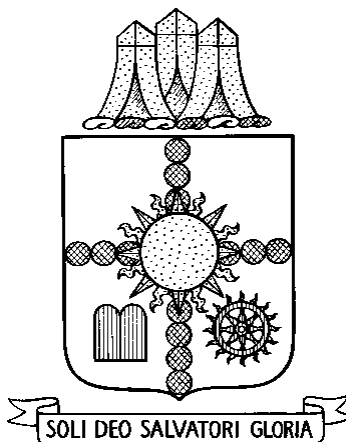
Profession of Faith
