The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a religious preparation process which introduces and explains the Catholic Faith to adults while preparing them to receive the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This spiritual journey is available to unbaptized persons, baptized Christians from other faiths, and Catholics who have not received Confirmation and First Eucharist. If you are a non-Catholic interested in becoming Roman Catholic, or a Catholic seeking to complete your initiation into the Church, we invite you to begin the RCIA at our parish. RCIA begins on Wednesday, October 4th at 7:00 PM on Zoom.
