MUSIC NOTES

Continuing upon last weekend's use of an American hymn for at the opening of our liturgies, this week we sing the haunting *Wondrous Love*. Unique to this time period, at the hymn's first publication in 1840 both tune and text were paired together. Interestingly, the meter is based on an old English ballad on the infamous pirate Captain Kidd.

Described by composer and hymnologist Erik Routley as "incomparably beautiful", *Wondrous Love* is in ABA form and fascinatingly uses the 'Dorian' mode (for those of you high on your Platonic church modes).

The prelude at the Saturday and Sunday morning liturgies is by George Walker, the first African-American composer to win the Pulitzer Prize in Music in 1996 for his work *Lilacs*. This short piece for solo organ was composed in memory of his grandmother.
