MUSIC NOTES

As we continue our series of opening hymns from the early American tradition, this week our opening procession features the hymn tune 'Detroit'. First appearing in the 1820 collection *Supplement to the Kentucky Harmony*, it was repeated unchanged in the 1835 *Southern Harmony* and revised for the 1844 collection *The Sacred Harp*. This music comes for the 'shape note' tradition, originating in Colonial New England and later popular in the Southern United States. It features modal harmony that, though primitive at first glance, often proves extremely beautiful in its haunting simplicity.

This spiritual journey is available to unbaptized persons, baptized Christians from other faiths, and Catholics who have not received Confirmation and First Eucharist. If you are a non-Catholic interested in becoming Roman Catholic, or a Catholic seeking to complete your initiation into the Church, we invite you to begin the RCIA at our parish. RCIA begins on Wednesday, October 4th at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom.
