A THANKSGIVING MESSAGE FROM THE PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR, MONSIGNOR KEVIN SULLIVAN

Dear Parishioners,

Thanksgiving aligns each year – give or take – with the Solemnity of Christ the King and the First Sunday of Advent. We end and begin the Church year.

Let me give thanks for all your support during the past year, and I thank you in advance for your support in the upcoming year. I also give thanks that both the Church and Chapel are more filled on Sundays than in recent years. Numbers are not the only criteria of strength, yet they indicate the support that parishioners give to each other in living out our faith. In the troubling world we live in, our support for one another is needed more than ever. I thank you for your efforts to regularly celebrate Sunday Mass with us. We thank our young adults who now make up a very significant portion of our congregation. I thank you for praying with us, and I ask you to invite others to join us.

Let me briefly mention a few items on the agenda for Advent:

Thursday Faith Enrichment: Both Fr. Enzo and Virginia Hill will continue monthly scriptural reflections at the Church and sessions on the Eucharist at the Chapel. (See the bulletin for specifics on both.) Our Young Adult group continues to meet with Fr. Enzo. I am grateful to Virginia and Fr. Enzo for their lead on these.

Neighborhood Menorah and Tree Lighting: On December 7th, the first night of Chanukah, we will again partner with the Murray Hill Neighborhood Association on the Park Avenue Menorah and Tree Lighting. Afterwards, we will open the undercroft of the Church for a reception to be a welcoming good neighbor. All parishioners are cordially invited. I thank Heather Dolland Tamam for her work in organizing this.

Laetare Sunday Choral Concert December 17: At Sunday's 5:00 p.m. Mass, we welcome new candidates for the sacraments of initiation. At 6:00 p.m., immediately *after* the Mass, Director of Music Buck McDaniel leads the esteemed Choir of Our Saviour & Sacred Hearts in a 30-minute concert of music for Advent & Christmas. All are invited and welcome. We will also take this opportunity to thank all those who minister in our parish as readers, Eucharistic ministers, outreach volunteers to the homeless, and young adult leaders. Join us for this Sunday evening Mass.

Light the World - Giving Machines: You will soon notice a bright red giving machine in front of Our Saviour Church. I am pleased that Our Saviour Church is part of this worldwide Christmas interfaith initiative to link our faith with helping those in need throughout the world. A bulletin insert in the bulletin provides more details.

Outdoor Nativity Scene: We are enhancing the outdoor Nativity scene in our garden at Park Avenue and 38th Street. We pray that it gives greater witness to our faith in the incarnation of Christ among us as we celebrate the Advent and Christmas season. I am grateful that one of our parishioners, Sheila Lennon, has taken the lead on this.

Reconciliation Room: Penitents have had the option of going to confession for the Sacrament of Reconciliation either behind a screen *or* face-to-face. At Our Saviour, we have not yet afforded adequate space for these options. Shortly we will be converting one of the confessionals into a space to reverently provide parishioners with both options.



HOMILY

Profession of Faith


MYSTERY OF FAITH Sung by the Assembly


