SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

Opportunity for Input

Walking Together Towards God's Kingdom

For the past few years Pope Francis has asked the Church throughout the world to reflect upon how all of us – parishioners, priests, bishops, Pope, etc. - might better walk together on our earthly journey to God's heavenly kingdom. The technical theological term used for this has been "synodality." Our Saviour parish hosted a productive listening session for more than 150 people on a Saturday morning over a year ago in the Church's undercroft.

Last October, Pope Francis held a worldwide meeting (synod) in Rome that Cardinal Dolan attended. A second session will be held this fall. Cardinal Dolan has asked for additional input from parishioners in the Archdiocese of New York in preparation for the second session. (We just learned of the very tight timeframe.)

To provide our parishioners with the opportunity to provide input, I ask that any interested parishioners simply respond this week by Wednesday March 20. to the following three questions. Simply send your responses in an email to the parish office@oursaviour.org. Thank you.

- 1) What encouraging things (structures, leadership, etc.) have I experienced in the Church and parish that foster the Church's mission?
- 2) What discouraging things (structures, leadership, etc.) have I experienced in the Church and parish that have hindered the Church's mission?
- 3) How can the Church and parish help parishioners, both individually and as a community, to better live and give witness to the love and mercy of Jesus?
