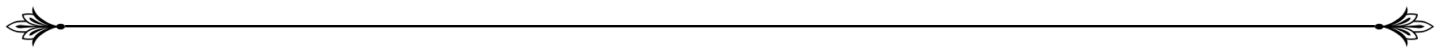

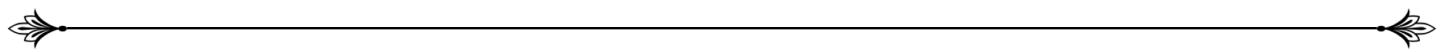

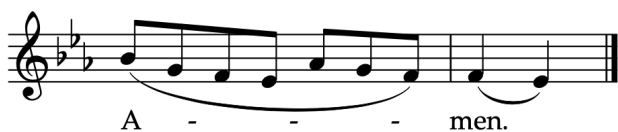

COLLECT

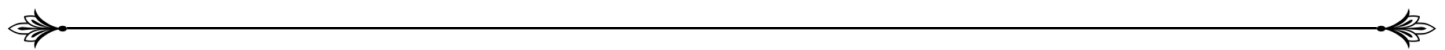
