


PENITENTIAL ACT

AMERICAN MUSIC IN THE MASS

As we celebrate Independence Day Weekend, allow me to point out three contributions by American composers to this weekend's liturgies:

The final hymn, *McKee*, was adapted and arranged by Harry T. Burleigh, a native New Yorker and seminal contributor to the "American sound". An assistant and somewhat protégé of Antonin Dvorak, it was Burleigh who provided the materials that were the basis for Dvorak's 9th Symphony, "From the New World". Burleigh is oft cited as the first arranger and compiler of the American Spiritual tradition, music that originated as slave work songs and is perhaps the most original and influential of the music found in the North America: Jazz, Blues, Rock & Roll, among others all trace their origins to the work song tradition.

At the Offertory, we sing *Ora Labora*, a hymn that is unfamiliar to many American Catholics, but traces its origin to Midtown Manhattan. T. Tertius Noble immigrated to the United States at the turn of the 20th century to found the Saint Thomas Choir School, located at 5th Avenue and 53rd Street. This hymn has become their "fight song", and it's a reaction to this weekend's Gospel reading.

Prior to Mass, we hear organ music by George Walker, the first African American composer to win the Pulitzer Prize. Since his death in 2018, his work has been revisited with renewed interest- his work *Lyric for Strings* is among the most performed orchestral works by an American composer in the standard repertoire.
