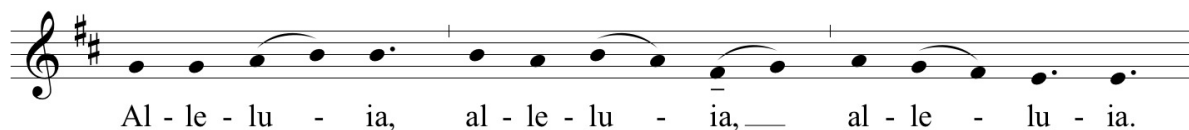
SECOND READING *I Corinthians 1:26-31*

GESIMA SUNDAYS

According to the preconciliar liturgical calendar (i.e. before the Second Vatican Council), Lent is anticipated by three Sundays of “pre-Lent.” Just as during Lent itself, the *Gloria* and *Alleluia* are omitted, and the color is violet in this “Gesimatide.” Although no such liturgical alterations now differentiate them, these three Sundays may still be referred to by their ancient Latin titles: *Septuagesima*, *Sexagesima*, and *Quinquagesima*, which mean the seventieth, sixtieth, and fiftieth day [before Easter] respectively. These titles relate to the name of Lent: *Quadragesima*, meaning “fortieth.” Obviously the titles only approximately correspond with the number of days they indicate.





DISPATCH FROM THE PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Dear Parishioners:

At the beginning of the Week of Christian Unity on January 18, our parish welcomed 5 new young adults into the Catholic Church. More than 20 other young adults will be receiving sacraments at Easter. While we congratulate them, allow me to congratulate you, our parishioners. Your presence and support as a worshipping community of faith have been, and remain, an important part of these candidates' faith journey. Thank you.

I would like to ask for your assistance in furthering the vibrancy of our parish community of Our Saviour and Sacred Hearts. After discussion with our parish Trustees and staff, we are planning to establish a parish council to further strengthen our parish. One of our trustees with a bit of my wordsmithing put together a preliminary "mission statement."

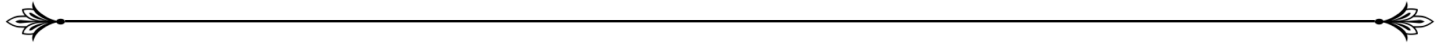

"SPRUCING UP" THE UNDERCROFT KITCHEN AND ADJACENT ROOM

With Cardinal Dolan moving into the residence at the Church of Our Saviour, we want to ensure that the rest of the building continues to provide welcoming and functional space for meeting with parishioners and hosting parish activities. The primary work will focus on sprucing up and updating the kitchen and adjacent undercroft area where many of these activities take place. This will include ensuring that electrical outlets and kitchen appliances are in proper working order, as well as adding tables and shelving to allow for more orderly arrangement and storage. Because this space is used weekly for our partnership with the Community of Sant'Egidio, particularly the Tuesday evening supper for those without homes, as well as other street outreach, it is important that the area be clean, dignified, and adequate for these ministries.
