**THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:** Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

**THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** First & Third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the Rectory Office to schedule one of the available Sundays. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.


RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: A process for those who wish to enter the Catholic Faith, or for present Catholic individuals who after being baptized may need to receive the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. For more information, please call the Rectory Office.

**THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin *at least six months* before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). It is required that either the bride or groom must be a registered and practicing member of Immaculate Conception Church

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, please call the Parish Rectory to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at mass during the Advent and Lenten seasons. Please notify us of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance.

WELCOME TO NEW PARISHIONERS: The Immaculate Conception community warmly welcomes you! Please introduce yourself to the celebrant of the mass you are attending as you leave the church so that, on behalf of the entire community you may be welcomed. You can register at the Parish Office and receive any information needed from the office receptionist. Kindly notify us of any change of address.

The feast of the Epiphany, which was kept in the East and in certain Western Churches before being observed in Rome, seems to have been originally a feast of the nativity. Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem, He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. In the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, we see, in a way, the beginnings of the Christian faith.

The Epiphany is indeed a great Feast, and the joy caused by the birth of Jesus must be renewed on it, for as though it were a second Christmas Day, it shows us our Incarnate God in a new light. At Christmas it was a few Shepherds that were invited

Requirements for a sponsor: Must be 16 years of age; fully initiated Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; Currently practicing their Catholic faith through weekly participation at Mass; committed to living a lifestyle centered on Christian morals; and NOT either of the candidate's parent.
