THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: First & Third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the Rectory Office to schedule one of the available Sundays. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: A process for those who wish to enter the Catholic Faith, or for present Catholic individuals who after being baptized may need to receive the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. For more information, please call the Rectory Office.


THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). It is required that either the bride or groom must be a registered and practicing member of Immaculate Conception Church


PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, please call the Parish Rectory to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at mass during the Advent and Lenten seasons. Please notify us of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance.

April 4, 2021 Easter Sunday

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Exult, let them exult the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound loud our mighty King's triumph! Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be

glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness."

Those words began the most glorious mass of the year in

the Catholic Church, the Easter Vigil. Christ indeed has risen, the gift of eternal life, not death, is ours. The darkness of sin has been broken by the light of glory. The cross which we worship as our sign of faith, is now glorified, no longer a symbol of death but one of hope This is what we have fasted, prayed, and reconciled for this Lent.

Like Mary Magdalene in the gospel this morning, we too

want to shout out 'HE HAS RISEN!" It is the joy of Christ's resurrection that fills our hearts today. The empty, barren feeling many of us had because of our Lenten journey of fasting and self-sacrifice has been rewarded. Like the emptiness of the tomb, there is no more death but life, eternal.

At the Easter Vigil the candle was blessed and lit from the new fire. The Fire represents Christ's resurrection. The lit candle is the Light of Christ that shines in the darkness. The five grains of incense that were inserted at the vigil, represent the five wounds of Christ. This year's candle is called "SPIRIT OF JERUSALEM".

The security that the mountains give Jerusalem are a direct reflection of eternal security that faith gives us as believers. The large central cross represents the strength of Christianity. The four smaller crosses are said to symbolize the four Gospels, the four wounds of Christ, or the four directions in which the Word of Christ spread from Jerusalem.

During the season of Easter, the Pascal Candle and the Baptismal Font will remain in the Sanctuary. Please after mass come view the beauty of our candle and also retrieve a holy water from the font to be brought home.

On behalf of Deacon Phil Marino, Deacon John Sadowski, Ughetta Jilleba, our Religious Co-Ordinator, and Margie Celenza, our Parish Secretary, I wish to extend to all of you and your families a blessed Easter. May this Easter season be a time of joy and peace for all of us. May the promise of eternal life strengthen us to be faithful imitators of the risen Christ.

The Story of God

God's true story is written in the Bible. It is simple: God – the Father; God, The Son – Jesus, Our Savior; and God – The Holy Spirit are three Persons in One. God is Love. God, Our Father and Creator, made heaven and earth. Out of love and so that we could be with Him forever, God created human beings in His image and likeness. He created us to know Him, love Him, serve Him and be happy with Him in Heaven. God's plan for humanity is that we would always be in a loving relationship/bond with Him. In God we have our being - we are a member of the family of God.

Adam and Eve were the first to be made in His image and likeness. They choose to listen to the devil and to be separated from the love of God by not obeying God (sin). They ate the fruit from the tree of knowledge. Thereafter, we humans have sinned and this sin has caused a break in our bond with God. Sin separates us from truth. But God didn't give up on us — and did not leave us in brokenness. God had a plan to save us. He sent His Son, Jesus, (who is God and man) to come and win us back to God — to redeem us and have that special loving bond with God.

Jesus was born of the Virgin Mary, lived, was crucified, died and rose from the dead in order to gain power over our sins and death. He laid down His own life for us so that we can have eternal life. Jesus gave us the Church and the celebration of the Mass – not to entertain us – but to be able to receive Him – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Jesus is alive. He is among us. It hurts Jesus not only when one does not receive Him in the Eucharist but when one receives Him unaware of knowing that it Jesus – His Real Presence. Even in the smallest particle of the Eucharist Jesus is alive and present.

St. Peter (Jesus' Apostle) said, "This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnessed. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured out this which you see and hear. For David not ascend into the heavens; but he himself says, 'The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, till I make thy enemies a stool for thy feet.' Let all the house of Israel therefore know assuredly that God has made Him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified. Now when

they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children and to all that are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Him.' And he testified with many other words and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this crooked generation.' So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about 3,000 souls."

Something to think about...If you make your own God to follow, you live in make believe. Whatever you do, say and think, you are either following God or the devil. The devil's commandment is to do whatever you want. God loves you and has a plan for your life. Jesus died to save you. We are called to convert – change our lives to the Kingdom of God. It is up to you to respond to His gift of grace and mercy. Jesus waits for each of us to say "yes" to repenting of our sins, believing in Him, and living a life that glorifies God, so we can live forever in Heaven. The choice is your own. Would you like to choose God's grace and mercy today and begin a lifetime of following Christ? Then seek Him.

So, today, Easter Sunday - Know that Our Lord and Savior Loves You no matter what....We are all broken and need to be fixed. God created you because He loves you. And, God is waiting for you to believe in Him and to love Him too. Make that commitment and place your hands on your heart and tell Him "I want you Lord in my life." Give yourself to God. Tell Him you will follow Him all the days of your life. Make Jesus the center of your life from the time you wake up until the time you go to sleep and you will discover that the life He created for you is amazing with the love of God the Father, God the son Jesus and God the Holy Spirit in your heart. Include Him in every meal, every function, every party/gathering, every decision and whatever you do. Know and feel His presence and He will guide you to the happiness and love you seek. - The story of God is the same yesterday, today and forever tomorrow.
