

A Blessed Happy Mother's Day to all of our moms! What a gift you all are! God bless all our moms who are physically with us and for our moms looking down on us from heaven. We celebrate all of you, our birth moms and all those who fulfill the role of 'mom' in so many ways. Mother's Day has had an extra meaning to me. It was on Mother's Day, May 12, 1991, the day after my Ordination to the Priesthood, that I celebrated my 'First Mass'. On behalf of your children, THANK YOU for all that you do, continue to do, and have done. May all our mothers be greatly blessed as they continue to follow the example of Mary, the mother of us all. All returned Mother's Day Intention envelopes that have been returned are placed on the altar. As more come in today, they as well will be placed and remain on the altar for the rest of the month

Yesterday, eighteen of our second graders received their First Holy Communion. You see their names on the cover of our bulletin this week. We continue our prayers for them as they now come to know Christ, in the breaking of the bread. May they through the innocence of their faith, continually remind us of Jesus' words, "Unless you become like a child, you will not enter the kingdom of God." At the conclusion of the celebration yesterday, the students crowned Mary, our Mother to honor her this month of May. Today, our second graders will be hosting our May Family Mass at 9:30.

This Wednesday I will celebrate the thirty first anniversary of my priesthood. Throughout these years, I have truly been blessed, but not as blessed as being your Pastor for the last five years. We have accomplished so much here at Immaculate, as I pointed out with the Cardinal's remarks about this parish during the homily at the mass we hosted for Rockland and Orange counties. Following their Profession of Faith, they were anointed with the Sacred Chrism and became fully initiated and received into our Catholic Faith. On behalf of all of us, I send congratulation to both of you and may God continue to bless you as you grow in your faith.

The Mass book will open this Tuesday, May 10th for the months of July to December. To help avoid the remainder of the years intentions being all filled up by August, there will be, as in the past, a three mass intention limit. This will allow the parish to have immediate intentions for our day-to-day requests, which several of you have shared with me your appreciation for doing that.

Last Sunday I had the privilege of assisting Bishop O'Hara in handing out the Catholic Scouting emblems to over 150 scouts throughout the Archdiocese. Scouts and families came to St. Patrick's Cathedral for the celebration of the Scout Emblem Mass. Bishop O'Hara shared his reception of his awards in his homily. That made me flash back to my memory of receiving my Ad Alteri Dei (to the altar of God), and the Pope Pius XII emblems given to me by Terrence Cardinal Cooke. The Scout Law stating 'A Scout is Reverent' was very much alive last Sunday.

As we continue celebrating the joy of this Easter season and journey towards Pentecost, may God continue the good work we do in the name if Christ, His Son,
