





# 7 Sorrows & 7 Joys of St. Joseph

St. Joseph has a special relationship to Jesus and Mary, and we can rely on his powerful intercession in our lives. **To honor the end of the Year of St. Joseph, we are praying the 7 Sorrows & 7 Joys of St. Joseph before all Masses up until the beginning of Advent.** These prayers will be led by our Rosary Leader 10 minutes before Mass. Here are the prayers for this week:

## **2nd Sorrow of St. Joseph: The Poverty of Jesus' Birth**

And while they were there, the time came for her to have her child. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. (Luke 2:6-7)

## **2nd Joy of St. Joseph: The Birth of the Savior of Mankind**

And the Angel said to them: "Fear not for behold I bring you good tidings of great joy...For, this day, is born to you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord..." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly army, praising God, and saying: "Glory to God in the highest; and on earth peace to men of good will." And they found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. (Luke 2:10-19)

O Glorious St. Joseph, chosen to be the virgin father of the Word made flesh, your sorrow at seeing the child Jesus born in such poverty was changed into heavenly exultation when you heard the angelic hymn and beheld the glories of that resplendent night. By this sorrow and joy, we beg you to obtain for us the grace to one day hear the angelic songs of praise and rejoice in the shining splendor of heavenly glory.

## **LovePac Aubrey**


