

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

"Receive the light of Christ. This light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. You have been enlightened by Christ. You are to walk always as a child of the light. May the flame of faith be kept alive in your heart. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom." -from the Rite of Baptism

Every year on February 2nd, the Church celebrates the great Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple along with the Blessing of the Candles. This is an ancient celebration, dating back to the early Church Fathers.

Christ, the Light of the World enters His temple after His birth and is obedient to the law. The Lord fulfills the law of God given to Moses. We too are called to fidelity to God and His law. When lit, candles represent fidelity, life, and faith.

Many families keep a devotional area or altar somewhere in the home with images of loved ones and religious images. This becomes a place of prayer. It is appropriate to have a vigil candle lit during such times of prayer. Typically, candles used for this purpose are beeswax, simple in design, and unscented.

The weekend of February 5th and 6th, we will celebrate Candlemas and the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple at all Masses. You and your family are encouraged to bring personal candles from home which you wish to have blessed for use throughout the year. The blessing of the candles will take place at the beginning of each Mass.
