





EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING 2024

The father, or senior member of the family, should trace the following with blessed chalk above the front door, on the external doorframe. This represents the year and the initials of the three Magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar). The prayers below are then said inside the main entrance of the house.

20 + C + M + B + 24

Father/leader: Peace be to this house.

All: And to all that dwell herein.

Father/leader: From the east the Magi came to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures, they offered costly gifts: gold to the great King, incense to the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. Alleluia.

All: (sign yourself with the Cross and say together the Magnificat) My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

All: From the east, the Magi came to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures, they offered costly gifts: gold to the great King, incense to the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. Alleluia.

Father/leader: Our Father...and lead us not into temptation

All: but deliver us from evil.

Father/leader: All they from Saba shall come...

All: bringing gold and frankincense.

Father/leader: O Lord, hear my prayer... **All:** and let my cry come to Thee.

Father/leader: Let us pray. O God, who by the guidance of a star did this day reveal thy Only Begotten Son to the Gentiles, grant that we who now know thee by faith may be brought to the contemplation of thy heavenly majesty. Grant this through the same Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever.

All: Amen.

Father/leader: Be enlightened, be enlightened, O Jerusalem, for thy light has come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee - Jesus Christ born of the Virgin Mary.

Father/leader: Nations shall walk in thy light, and kings in the splendor of thy birth...

All: and the glory of the Lord has risen upon Thee.

Father/leader: Let us pray. Bless, O Lord almighty God, this home, that it be the shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to the commandments, and thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May blessing remain for all time upon this dwelling and all who live herein. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

After the prayers of the blessing are recited, the father, or senior member of the family, should sprinkle each of the rooms with holy water. The same inscription may then be traced with chalk above the doors throughout the house as desired, especially above the children's rooms.

Background: Abortion was legalized in the United States (Roe v. Wade) on January 22, 1973. Since 1974, each year in late-January, Pro-Life Americans have held a peaceful protest called "The March for Life," which has developed into the largest annual gathering of Pro-Lifers in the country to raise awareness about the evil of abortion and pray for an end to abortion. On the brighter side these decades of prayers were answered in mid-2022 when the Supreme Court's ruling on the Dobbs v. Jackson case over-turned Roe v. Wade, thereby de-Federalizing legalized abortion in the USA and returning abortion law to the States.

ALSO, this year we will be chartering a bus on Saturday January 20th to take SMdP parishioners to downtown Dallas to attend the Ft Worth & Dallas Dioceses joint March for Life Mass at 10am, followed by marching in the March for Life!! Please watch for additional information on this event for Saturday Jan. 20th!

The Holy Eucharist: Perpetually Epiphanic

God's manifestation among us! What could be better than a true epiphany? It must have been quite an experience for those blessed to have been in God's presence under that shimmering star of Bethlehem. An extraordinary family, Joseph, Mary, and Jesus, yet completely accessible to the world: a world filled with sin, brokenness, and despair. The Feast of the Epiphany is an opportunity for all of us to glory in the truth of the Christ's birth glowing in holiness for all to see.

Many throughout salvation history have claimed to be gods, from Pharoah in Egypt to King Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon, and Caesar Augustus in Rome, but none of them could compare to the true King of kings, Jesus the Christ, truly Our Lord and Savior. When we think of an epiphany, we expect palaces, glorious vestments, rich foods, pomp and circumstance, the whole bit! Yet this king was born in a simple stable, lying in a manger, a place for livestock to feed, in a town called Bethlehem.

We are familiar, perhaps overly so, with the shepherds, the magi, the livestock, the entire scene, yet this festival celebration offers us an opportunity to go deeper. The word, "Bethlehem," in Hebrew means, "house of bread," and in Arabic means, "house of meat." Our Lord is food for the hungry, drink for the thirsty, fulfilling all of our needs, and he does so through the Holy Eucharist that we are able to receive at every Mass, an epiphany no less glorious, no less personal, no less intimate, a real and fully present manifestation of the Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

The shepherds themselves took good care of their sheep, and for Passover, would inspect particularly the first-born male lambs, wrapping them in swaddling clothes for inspection to see if they were without blemish for the Passover sacrifice. Our Lord is that unblemished first-born male lamb sacrificed for all of us.

The magi were patrons of the black arts and received their wisdom from soothsaying and the astrological signs of the occult. For this reason, they were initially called "wise men", but truly we may call them wisemen today because upon encountering the Christ child, they willingly prostrated themselves in submission of His true kingship, and they renounced their former occult practices, and offered their former instruments to be used for good: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. It's a renunciation of their former ways, and a true enlightenment and conversion as Christians.

The epiphany offers us a glorious realization of God's love for us by sending us His only Son, to enlighten us, and to save us from sin. A true king, truly manifested in the Holy Eucharist. Don't miss the opportunity daily to adore Our Lord on the altar in Eucharistic adoration! And be thankful at each and every Mass for His epiphany, a glorious manifestation for you!


