



St. Martin de Porres Peru Mission Support Group News and Updates

Just as Saint Martin de Porres served those in need in Lima hundreds of years ago, our **SMdP Peru Mission Support Group** is coordinating efforts to continue his work in spirit. We are working with members of the Pro Ecclesia Sancta order located in Lima to support ongoing local missions.

Through our group's personal financial donations, we have enabled Fr. Pedro, a Catholic pastor in an impoverished part of the city, to provide income to two women in his community with work as cooks in their parish-run soup kitchen. The soup kitchen prepares and delivers daily meals for local preschool-aged children, while also serving lunch every day to as many as 150 people who arrive with whatever containers they have to feed their families. Many of the locals in this particular community live in makeshift homes crafted together from abandoned debris. Despite their impoverished living conditions, these Peruvians still live their lives with dignity. All who come are served, but for those that can afford it, the church asks for S/5 (~\$1.30 USD) per meal.

We are truly a universal church. Join us in prayer as we continue to offer intentions for both those that are serving in this mission and those being served. In the future, we will share additional updates on other missions we are supporting.



Living Lent as a Family-Ideas



1. Make a holy hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament once a week

(Adoration times in the bulletin)

- 2. Pray the rosary as a family each night during Lent
- 3. Go to daily Mass during the Lenten season
- 4. Choose to read the Bible for 30 minutes each day (Consider starting with the Gospels)
- 5. Pray morning prayer and evening prayer from the Divine Office during the Lenten season (divineoffice.org; ibreviary.com)
- 6. Make an examination of conscience each Friday and a Litany of the Sacred Heart to make preparation for pesonal sins and inordinate attachments
- 7. Pray Divine Mercy Chaplet each afternoon at 3:00 PM (the hour Jesus died on the cross)
- 8. Go to confession at least once during the Lenten season



1. Be faithful to the Church's precept regarding fasting on

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (ages 18-59)

- 2. Be faithful to the Church's precept regarding abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent (ages 14 and up)
- 3. Choose to abstain from eating at restaurants during Lent
- 4. Fast from your favorite food(s)
- 5. Fast from your favorite program or sporting event on television OR even consider fasting from television all together
 - 6. Fast from social media
- 7. Fast from intemperate conversations that may lead to gossip and complaining
- 8. Fast from playing video games


