LENT BEGINS THIS WEDNESDAY LENTEN FASTING REGULATIONS

During the Season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of faith and abstinence.



Abstinence on all the Fridays of Lent, and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

- * No meat may be eaten on days of abstinence.
- * Catholics 14 years and older are bound to abstain from meat. Invalids, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt. Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- * Fasting means having only one full meal to maintain one's strength. Two smaller, meatless and penitential meals are permitted according to one's needs, but they should not together equal the one full meal. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- * Catholics over 18 but not yet 60 years are bound to fast. Again, invalids, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt.
 - All Fridays in Lent are days of Abstinence from meat.

Every Friday evening during Lent there will be Stations of the Cross at 7PM in St. Mary's Church with Benediction following.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time February 23, 2020

"You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. Though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not incur sin because of him. Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord... Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?"

The sin of anger constantly knocks on our door. Driving, they call it road rage, when we discriminate, we call it hate, when we are jealous, envy takes over.

The expression 'I don't get mad I just get even' is a violation of the direction of the earliest pages of scripture. I might find it hard to show love for someone who disagrees with me, or has injured me in some way.

It is the loving Lord who knows our trials and our wounds, He suffered them as well. If I realize that He lives in me, and in others, it might make it easier to say 'Lord because you are in me, please help me to find You in the other. May I love You in them.'

NEXT WEEK'S READINGS FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

This passage from Genesis narrates the creation of man, the temptation by the serpent, and the fall of Adam and Eve.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19

Paul tells the Romans that Adam's disobedience brought sin and death to the world, but Christ's dying on the cross for us will bring us salvation and life.

Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11

In preparation for His ministry, Jesus goes into the desert to fast and pray for 40 days. There He is tempted by the devil to give evidence of His miraculous powers, but Jesus resists the devil saying, "Away with you Satan! You shall do homage to the Lord your God; Him alone shall you adore."
