Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. It is a day when we reflect on our own mortality and the need for repentance because the end can come at any time. The ash cross that we receive on our forehead is a physical reminder that we will someday return back to dust. During this day, Catholics are placed into a proper mindset for the ENTER INTO THE SEASON OF LENT Lenten Season. While preparing for Easter, Catholics purify the body and soul through

fasting, abstinence, prayer, confession, and works of mercy. In other words, mortification and penance. The focus on our own mortality during Ash Wednesday sets us up for a good Lent that is then counter balanced by the celebration of Christ's triumph over death at Easter.

Did You Know?

Taking place just hours after John Paul II was canonized in Rome by Pope Francis on Divine Mercy Sunday, a relic of the newly proclaimed St. John Paul II was carried a mile through the streets of downtown New Haven, CT. Hundreds of the faithful followed in procession singing hymns and praying the Rosary from the Polish church of St. Stanislaus to the Knights of Columbus Museum, where it was offered for veneration. The procession, which stretched more than four blocks along the sidewalks, was led by a Knight of Columbus Fourth Degree Honor Guard. The relic, a fragment of the pope's bloodstained cassock from the May 13, 1981 attempt on his life in St. Peter's Square, was encased in an ornate reliquary.
