Special Indulgences During the Year for Priests

During the Year for Priests, the gift of special Indulgences is granted as described in the Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary, published on 12 May, 2009.

The Plenary Indulgence is granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant who, in church or in chapel, devoutly attend the divine Sacrifice of Mass and offer prayers to Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest, for the priests of the Church, and any other good work which they have done on that day, so that he may sanctify them and form them in accordance with His Heart, as long as they have made expiation for their sins through sacramental confession and prayed in accordance with the Supreme Pontiff s intentions: on the days in which the Year for Priests begins and ends, on the day of the 150th anniversary of the pious passing of St. John Mary Vianney, on the first Thursday of the month or on any other day established by the local Ordinaries for the benefit of the faithful.

The Plenary Indulgence will likewise be granted to the elderly, the sick and all those who for any legitimate reason are confined to their homes who, with a mind detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, at home or wherever their impediment detains them, provided that on the above-mentioned days they recite prayers for the sanctification of priests and confidently offer the illnesses and hardships of their lives to God through Mary Queen of Apostles.

Lastly, the Partial Indulgence is granted to all the faithful every time they devoutly recite five Our Fathers, Hail Mary's and Gloria's, or another expressly approved prayer, in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to obtain that priests be preserved in purity and holiness of life.

This Decree is valid for the entire duration of the Year for Priests.

Year for Priests begins June 19, 2009, and ends June 19, 2010. The year 2009 celebrates the 150th anniversary of the passing of St. John Mary Vianney.





Devotions to Mary Our Lady of Perpetual Help



Catholics have always prayed to the Blessed Virgin to ask her to intercede for us with Christ. For this reason, Mary has been given the name of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. This is related to a Byzantine icon that has been in Rome for 500 years. On the left of the icon, the Archangel Michael carries a lance and a sponge, signifying the Crucifixion. On the right, the Archangel Gabriel holds a cross and nails. Jesus, frightened by a vision of his passion, has run to Mary so quickly that he has nearly lost one of his sandals. He clings to his mother for comfort. Mary points to her Son, her face is solemn, and she looks directly at us. The Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is June 27.

O Mother of Perpetual Help, grant that I may ever invoke your most powerful name, which is the safeguard of the living and the salvation of the dying. O Purest Mary, O Sweetest Mary, let your name henceforth be ever on my lips. Delay not, O Blessed Lady, to help me whenever I call on you, for, in all my needs, in all my temptations I shall never cease to call on you, ever repeating your sacred name, Mary, Mary. O what consolation, what sweetness, what confidence, what emotion fill my soul when I pronounce your sacred name, or even only think of you. I thank God for having given you, for my good, so sweet, so powerful, so lovely a name. But I will not be content with merely pronouncing your name: let my love for you prompt me ever to hail you, Mother of Perpetual Help.
