Let them grow together with the harvest.

A problem which vexes many people is that the Church is made up of saints and sinners. Occasionally, we meet someone who is more than just a little bad. We wonder, why does God let them be here? Well, we just do not know. God seems content to wait until the very end before punishing them. I suppose we should thank God because He is not hasty in His judgment, but is always hoping and waiting for us to turn to Him and ask for healing. If He can change water into wine, and wine into His blood, He could change us from weeds into wheat.



Why do Catholics do that?

What are sacred symbols? (This week we will discuss two of them.)

Water, oil, and light are three sacred elements that symbolize elements of our faith. Holy water is the universal symbol of spiritual cleansing. The custom of using holy water in the Church dates back to its early days. It is used in liturgical and devotional ways. Catholics bless themselves on entering a church and often keep holy water in their homes. Of special significance is the water blessed during the Easter Vigil.

Oil has always symbolized strength. Holy oils used in rituals intend to portray spiritual strength. The oil of catechumens is used in baptism; the oil of the sick is used in anointing the ill and infirm. **Chrism**, a special mixture of olive oil and balm, is used in the other sacraments which require anointing: baptism, confirmation, and holy orders. Sacred oils are solemnly blessed by the bishop in the liturgy of Holy Thursday in the cathedral.
