Jesus asked James and John if they could share in His chalice and His baptism. It was an attractive proposal, to join in the most intimate facets of our Lord's life and ministry. The holy sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist fulfill this proposal to some degree. But our Lord was not simply talking about the Sacraments themselves, but about the very things which these Sacraments make present to us- His Passion and Death by which He won for us eternal salvation. We are called to an intimacy with Christ which far exceeds table fellowship or the profession of faith that He is God. We are invited to share the whole Christ, Cross and Glory. Father Joseph


