FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Angels,

Today we celebrate the second of four great manifestations of God in our midst. The word "epiphany" comes from Greek and it means a showing or manifestation.

We celebrated the first of these four manifestations on December 25. On Christmas God revealed Himself to us in the form of a helpless newborn infant. He was manifested as a babe born into homeless poverty, surrounded by the world's poor and outcasts who are represented by the shepherds.

Who were the "Wise Men" and where did they come from? In the Greek text they are called *magoi* which is usually written as "Magi" in English. The Magi were a group or cast of scholars associated with the interpretation of dreams, Zoroastrianism, astrology, and magic (hence the name "Magi"). In later Christian tradition they were called kings ("We three kings of Orient are, under the influence of Psalm 72:10 ("May the kings of Sheba and Seba bring gifts!"), Isaiah 49:7 ("Kings shall see and arise; princes, and they shall prostrate themselves") and Isaiah 60:10 ("Their kings shall minister to you").

Scripture does not tell us their names or how many of them there were. However tradition has settled on three Magi because there were three kinds of gifts and given them the names Caspar, Balthasar, and Melchior. We are told that they came "from the east." This could refer to Persia, East Syria, Arabia, or actually any distant place.

On this feast of the Epiphany we see the recently born baby in similar circumstances, but those material and social surroundings are hardly touched upon. The emphasis in today's story, as we shall see, is different. Here are strangers, foreigners, and total outsiders coming to give royal homage to the tiny child. Thus the theme of Matthew's Gospel is "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations."
