# Readings for the Fifth Sunday of Easter

## 1st Reading – Acts 14:21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

## 2nd Reading – Revelation 21:1-5A

Then I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. I also saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them

and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away." The One who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."



## Gospel – John 13:31-33A, 34-35

When Judas had left them, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and God will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples if you have love for one another."

## My Dear Parish Family,

I've said it many times to many people, but I'll say it again - as a pastor who is responsible for the upkeep of all our parish buildings, I have been very lucky to follow two pastors who took excellent care of our building and grounds. Fr. Bauer and Fr. Mastrolia made sure all the structures were sound. They repaired and replaced building roofs, boilers, windows, lighting, and flooring. All the "big" projects were done before I moved here. I know that just sounds like common sense management, but sadly, that's not the universal experience in all of our parishes. Moreover, St. Anthony's has been doubly blessed by not only having involved pastors, but by having such immensely generous parishioners who make sure the physical needs of their spiritual home are addressed and maintained.

Because of this generosity, and the ongoing physical needs of our property, we are able to make plans to embark on two capital projects for this coming summer.

The first project will remove and replace all of the entrance doors to the school building. Most of these are the original doors (60 years old) and need replacing. The Baut Studios has been contracted to make and install the new doors. This is the same company that installed the new church doors. The cost for the entire project is \$52,440. This includes the custom building, removal, and replacement of all entrance doors. The funds for this project will not come from our parish accounts, but from a special school account that is maintained by the diocese for the capital needs of our school buildings.

The second project involves the façade of the church and the sidewalk in front of the church. JR Mason & CO will oversee both aspects of this project. The paint on the façade of the church is cracking and peeling. In preparation for our 100th year celebration next year, they will scrape and repaint the entire façade and make it look as good as new. They will also replace the entire sidewalk in front of the church and repair the cracks in the church steps. The sidewalk has many cracks and dangerous breakages from many years of weathering and it needs to be replaced for safety reasons. The cost for this entire project is \$40,147. The funds for this project will come out of our parish accounts, but the initial \$17,000 will come from a restricted account that can only be used for capital projects. So, for both projects, the only amount coming out of our operational account will be \$23,147. That may seem like a lot, but considering all the repairs we will complete, it is a very fair price.

Again, we are only able to do these projects because of your continued generosity. Many thanks again for your care and support of your parish. We literally could not do it without you.


