




Readings for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading – Genesis 18:20-32

In those days, the LORD said: "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great, and their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry against them that comes to me. I mean to find out." While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?" He answered, "I will not destroy it, if I find forty-five there." But Abraham persisted, saying "What if only forty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the forty." Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there." Still, Abraham went on, "Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?" The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?" He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

Responsorial Psalm –

R. Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.

2nd Reading – Colossians 2:12-14

Brothers and sisters: You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And even when you were dead in transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, he brought you to life along with him, having forgiven us all our transgressions; obliterating the bond against us, with

its legal claims, which was opposed to us, he also removed it from our midst, nailing it to the cross.



Gospel – Luke 11:1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

*Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come.
Give us each day our daily bread
and forgive us our sins
for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us,
and do not subject us to the final test."*

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence. "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Everyone who asks, receives; the one who seeks, finds.

My Dear Parish Family,

I pray that your summer has been enjoyable and relaxing so far. It is amazing to think that the summer is already half over. We've been busy here at St. Anthony's during the first half of summer. As you've probably noticed, we've been working on a few capital projects since the end of the school year and we're making very good progress. All the outer doors of the school building have been replaced. These new doors will provide greater weather protection and security to the school entrances. Large sections of sidewalk have also been repaired and replaced along with the inclusion of a new accessible corner curb which puts us in line with city regulations. Presently, we are in the process of scraping, repairing, and painting the wooden framing on the façade of the church. This is not only ascetically necessary, but it will help prevent further paint peeling and future water damage. We are also in the early stages of planning for a project that will replace the floors in the school gym. We will keep you posted as that project moves ahead.

Like with all older buildings, these types of repairs and replacements are necessary from time to time. And while these projects can be expensive, not addressing these needs could lead to greater repair expenses down the road. We are able to do these things because of your immense generosity to our parish. So, I sincerely thank you for all that you do that make all these capital improvements possible.

The "financial year" for our parish concludes at the end of August. It is our plan to provide you with a copy of the parish finances and budget sometime after then, so you will have a full picture of the financial health of your parish and understand how (and where) your generous support is spent.

St. Anthony School welcomes children from Pre-Kindergarten three year olds to Grade 8. Prospective students must be three years old by December 31. Families who are Yonkers residents are eligible to enroll their child in our Universal Pre-Kindergarten Four year old program {UPK4} tuition free. UPK4 students must be four by December 1.

Our school program, in partnership with parents, develops the spiritual, academic, and social needs of our students. Our academic program includes the core curriculum and Religion, Art, Music, Physical Education, Spanish, and Technology. All our students from Grades Kindergarten through Grade 8 have a Chrome book available for their use in the classroom.

Members of our Graduating Class of 2022 have been accepted at: All Hallows, Fordham, Iona, Kennedy Catholic, Maria Regina, Montfort, Roosevelt, Sacred Heart, and Stepinac for high school. Our Graduates received over \$460,000 in scholarships!
