

# World Youth Day 2016

Today is a day to be rejoiced in because myself along with millions of other young Catholics said 'yes' when the Lord called us and began our journey to World Youth Day 2016 in Krakow, Poland. Saying 'yes' looks different to all of us. For some it means packing up and heading to Europe to join the Pope in prayer. For others it simply means singing at Mass without hesitation, for Saint John Paul the Great believed that when we sing "it's as if we are praying twice." For others it means taking that mission trip you've always wanted to take, leading a small group, reaching out to your co-worker who doesn't know Jesus, or sparing a few of your valuables and tithing. Regardless of what it may look like for you, there has never been a more necessary time to bring the gospel to those around us and to live out the scripture in our daily lives.

While addressing the youth in Rome at World Youth Day in 2000 Saint John Paul the Great said, "The liberating message of the Gospel of Life has been put into your hands... Like the great Apostle Paul, you too must feel the full urgency of the task. [...] This is no time to be ashamed of the Gospel. It is the time to preach it from the rooftops!"

While Bailey, Lauren, Tim, and myself are away I encourage you to find peace in knowing that we are praying for you in the presence of the Holy Father. Take time to read scripture, not with mere passiveness and prior understanding but with great purpose and ask yourself how God might be calling *you*. Understand that the church is universal and we encounter nothing alone. Remind yourself that though we may be broken, God is eager to use us just as we are.

"Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ!"
