

Pastor's Note...

This past Thursday, January 31, was the Memorial of St. John Bosco. He lived from 1815-1888.

After being ordained a priest in 1841 he dedicated his life to caring for boys who were



from difficult family situations and many of whom had been in serious legal trouble, often having spent time in prison.

John Bosco is admired because of his work with troubled boys and teenagers.

I suspect that John Bosco would not be allowed to do today the things he did in the 19th century. A modern day

John Bosco would be suspected of the sexual abuse of minors. I think this is terribly sad.

Of course the greatest harm of the scandal involving the sexual abuse of minors is the damage done to the victims. However, another negative consequence is to the possibility of ministering to minors.

Let us continue to pray for all victims of sexual abuse and also for the adults who seek to help boys and girls to grow up to be healthy, happy, and holy women and men.
