

Pastor's Note...

This coming Tuesday, October 15, is the Memorial of St. Teresa of Jesus (of Ávila) (1515-1582). October 1 we observed the Memorial of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus (of Lisieux) (1873-1897). These two great Saint Teresas point out some very important aspects of becoming holy. They have profound similarities and also significant differences.


I sometimes think of Teresa of Ávila as "big Teresa" and Thérèse of Lisieux as "little Teresa". Even their titles "of Jesus" and "of the Child Jesus" make this point.

Teresa of Ávila did huge things. She was one of the principal figures in the Catholic Counter-reformation. The church's response to the Protestant Reformation. She wrote profound books about prayer and the mystical life. She was a towering person during her own lifetime and remains so over 400 years later.

Thérèse of Lisieux by contrast never did anything big in the usual sense. In fact a crucial event in her life was coming to accept that her dreams of doing something extraordinary for God would not be realized. This acceptance led to a commitment to doing ordinary, everyday tasks as well and lovingly as possible. This dedication is the reason she is referred to as the saint of the "little way."

Both these great women have received the title "Doctor", that is "teacher" of the church. May they remind us that becoming holy is the fundamental vocation of every one of us. May they also help us remember that there are different methods of answering that basic calling.


