

Pastor's Note...



I realize that for our society Christmas is over. However, for the Church the Christmas Season has just begun. During these days the Church presents to us the implications of the reality of the Incarnation: God made human.

On December 26 we celebrated the Feast of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr and we're reminded that we are to witness to Jesus Christ by our way of life.

December 27 was the Feast of St. John the Evangelist. This feast underlines that God the Son came to bring good news.

December 28 was the Feast of the Holy Innocents. God made flesh shares in the worst of human suffering.

Today, the Sunday during the Octave of Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Central to the reality of the Incarnation is that God the Son experiences the joys and struggles of being part of a family.

January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, stresses that God the Son truly became human. God makes Himself one with us that we might be one again with God.

Next Sunday, January 5, we celebrate the Epiphany. On this day we celebrate that Christ came for all people. By the way, the Epiphany is the "Twelfth Day of Christmas."

Finally, the next Sunday, January 12, we conclude the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It may seem strange that this Feast is part of the Christmas Season. After all, Jesus was baptized as an adult – probably about 30 years after His birth.

Nonetheless, it is fitting that we celebrate His baptism to conclude the Christmas Season because this event marks the beginning of Jesus' public life. If Jesus had not carried out His mission then we would not celebrate His birth.

May this Christmas Season be a time of blessing for us. As St. Augustine said many centuries ago in a Christmas sermon, "We have the Christ child. Let us grow with Him."


