

Dear Parishioners,

There will be a SLIGHT change in the schedule for confessions in Frankfort. We will discontinue confessions on Wednesday evening and we will begin having confessions on Tuesday evening at 6:00 pm.

I have worked with the staff at both parishes in coming up with a weekly schedule for Fr. Dan and myself. We will be on a one week schedule for the weekday Masses. We will be on a two week schedule for the weekend Masses. For example I will be coming to Lebanon every Monday and Wednesday and will celebrate the Masses in Lebanon on those days. Fr. Dan will be coming to Frankfort every Monday and Wednesday and will celebrate the Masses in Frankfort on those days. Concerning the weekend schedule, if you do not see me this weekend, you will likely see me next weekend.

This schedule is meant to be a GENERAL schedule. Fr. Dan and I may change things if it seems like it helps us on any particular day.


