Advanced Placement (AP) -These are courses offered in conjunction with the College Board. High school students experience college-level curricula and examinations. When your child takes an AP course, they'll get a grade just like when they take any other course. Taking AP courses will help your child stand out to colleges and universities, but it won't earn them college credit. When your child takes an AP Exam in May, college faculty and experienced AP teachers review your child's responses and give the exam a score of 1–5. Your child will get credit at many colleges and universities for AP Exam scores of 3 or higher. To learn more about AP visit

Ivy Tech Community College - Take a Course On Us (TACO-U)! ALL high school juniors and seniors are eligible to apply for up to two 100 level college courses from Ivy Tech Community College. Take a Course on Us will cover the cost of the tuition for a 3 credit hour course (\$399.45) the technology fee (\$60). Textbooks will be at the student's own expense. All Seton Catholic High School students enrolled in the program will get a TACO-U study hall. The study hall gives students the opportunity to work together and extra time to complete assignments. Once completed, the course can be transferred to their high school transcript for weighted-credit.
