Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

(Readings: Jeremiah 20:7-9 — Romans 12:1-2 — Matthew 16:21-27)

Jeremiah, Maximin, You — In Chapter 1 of Jeremiah, the prophet attempted to refuse his vocation, citing his age. Nineteen chapters later he blames the Lord for giving him such a thankless task. There are indications in the story of Maximin Giraud and Mélanie Calvat that they sometimes wearied of the position that their encounter with the Beautiful Lady had put them in. Uneducated as they were, they were opposed and contradicted, by local government representatives and even in Church circles. Some called them liars; other said they were innocent dupes. They were hounded by the curious; a few persons even tried to involve them in political controversies of the day. There came a terrible moment in Maximin's life when, in 1850, 15 years old, he was brought to the famous Curé of Ars, St. John Vianney. After their encounter, the saint regretfully announced he no longer believed in the Apparition of La Salette. It was not until eight years later that he regained his faith in it. We know that Maximin's teens were a troubled period. He lost his father when he was 13. The Bishop of Grenoble was often annoyed with him for failing to take his schooling seriously. His later years were no easier for him. On one occasion, when he was 26, having the story of the Apparition, he concluded by saying that when the Lady disappeared, "She left me with all my faults." The Apparition changed his life in positive ways, of course. In his own way, he was 'transformed by the renewal of his mind.' He became a man of faith. But this did not change who he was. Humanly speaking, he was not a success. He carried his cross as best he could, and died at the age of 38. In his will he reaffirmed the truth of what he had witnessed on September 19, 1846. People often expect witnesses of Apparitions to become saints. Perhaps Maximin was a saint, just not a candidate for canonization. This is a comforting truth. Our goal in life is not to be canonized but, like Jeremiah, like Maximin, to be faithful to our vocation.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." 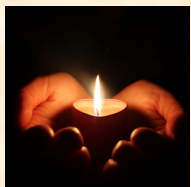

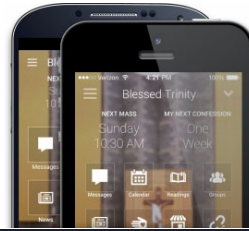

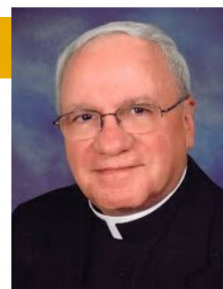

Jeremías, Maximino, Tú.

(Vigésimo Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario:

Jeremías 20:7-9; Romanos 12:1-2; Mateo 16:21-17)

En el capítulo 1 de Jeremías, el profeta intentó rechazar su vocación, mencionando su edad. Diecinueve capítulos después le echa la culpa al Señor por darle tamaña ingrata tarea.

Hay indicaciones en el relato de Maximino Giraud y Melania Calvat de que a veces ellos se sentían cansados de la position en la que su encuentro con la Bella Señora les había colocado. Analfabetos como eran, se les ponía oposición y se les hacia la contra, por representantes del gobierno local y aun de círculos eclesiales. Algunos los llamaban de mentirosos; otros decían que fueron engañados en su inocencia, eran acosados por los curiosos; unas cuantas personas intentaron envolverlos en las controversias políticas de aquellos días.

Llegó un momento terrible en la vida de Maximino, cuando en 1850, con 15 años de edad, fue llevado ante el famoso Cura de Ars, San Juan Vianney. Después del encuentro, el santo anunció lamentándose de que ya no creía en la Aparición de La Salette. No fue sino hasta ocho años después que él recuperó su fe en el acontecimiento de La Salette.

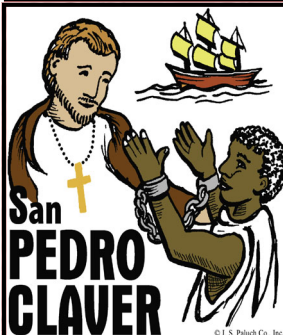
Sabemos que la adolescencia de Maximino fue un periodo problemático. Perdió a su padre a los 13 años. A menudo el Obispo de Grenoble se molestaba con él porque no tomaba su educación en serio. Sus años posteriores no fueron fáciles para él. En una ocasión, cuando tenía 26 años al contar la historia de la Aparición, concluyó diciendo: cuando desapareció, “Ella me dejo con todas mis faltas”

La aparición cambio su vida de maneras positivas, por supuesto. A su propio modo, el fue “transformado por la renovación de su mente”. Se convirtió en un hombre de fe.

Pero esto no cambio lo que él era. Humanamente hablando, no era un triunfo. Llevó su cruz lo mejor que podía, y murió a la edad de 38. En su testamento el reafirmó la verdad de aquello de lo cual fue testigo el 19 de septiembre de 1846.

La gente con frecuencia espera que los testigos de una aparición se hagan santos. Tal vez Maximino era un santo, solo que no era un candidato para la canonización.

Esta es una verdad reconfortante. Nuestra meta en la vida no es ser canonizados, sino como Jeremías, como Maximino, ser fieles a nuestra vocación.



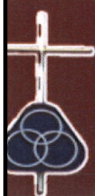
TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Muchos católicos afroamericanos son miembros de los Caballeros de san Pedro Claver, organización fundada para ellos en 1909, cuando el racismo no les permitía participar en organizaciones euroestadounidenses. Esta organización toma su nombre de un jesuita español del siglo XVII, Pedro, quien llegó a Cartagena (Colombia) en 1610 y se escandalizó ante la trata de esclavos en el continente americano. A pesar de censuras papales en contra de la esclavitud esta pecaminosa costumbre seguía robando humanidad a los africanos. Pedro se consagró al servicio de ellos, recibéndolos con caridad, comida y alivio apenas llegaban en los barcos.

Pedro no pudo liberar a los esclavos pero si se dedicó a servirlos y convertirlos. Él preparaba catequistas de entre los mismos africanos para que pudieran cristianizar a los recién llegados. Pedro Claver sufrió muchos insultos y calumnias por reunir a los africanos en iglesias y en especial, por darles los sacramentos cristianos. Sus propios superiores, dejándose llevar por las críticas de los criollos, lo castigaban por el trabajo que hacía con los esclavos. Por tal razón se autonombró como “Pedro Claver, de los negros, esclavo para siempre”.

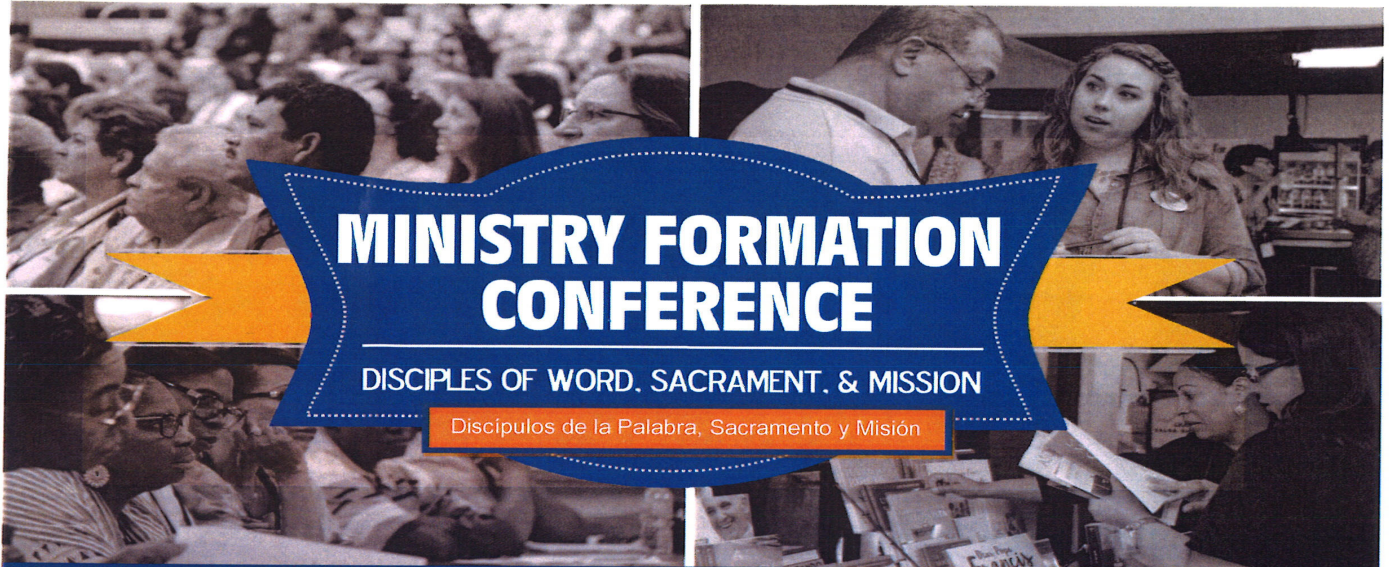

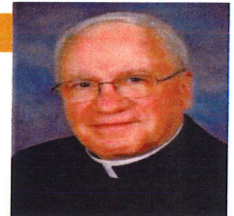
