Third Sunday of Advent

(Readings: Isaiah 61:1-2A, 10-11 — 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 — John 1:6-8, 19-28)

Identity — In her Magnificat (today's Responsorial Psalm), Mary joyfully identified herself as God's servant. This means she understood her role in God's plan. John the Baptist identified himself as a Voice. He, too, knew his role, his place. The Beautiful Lady of La Salette did not identify herself in this way, but she did indicate her role: "I am here to tell you great news." She identified herself, therefore, as God's Messenger. Isaiah describes himself in similar terms. He is sent by God to bring tidings, to proclaim, to announce. What we do, however, does not define us completely. When St. Paul encourages the Thessalonians to rejoice, to pray, to refrain from evil, there is an underlying reality that explains the doing, the role, the behavior. They are disciples of Jesus Christ, and therefore they live in a certain way. That is Mary's message at La Salette. The difference is that St. Paul was encouraging Christians who were aware of their identity, while Our Lady was speaking to those who had lost that sense of Christian identity, whose behavior contradicted it in many ways. Conversion, a turning back, a return to a Christian way of life, might restore that identity. Mary promises that if her people are converted, their fields will again produce abundantly. In a mirror-image way, this would fulfill Isaiah's prophecy: "As the earth brings forth its plants..., so will the Lord God make justice and praise spring up before all the nations." What all plants do, regardless of species, is to grow and produce fruit. That is the way God made them, and so they do God's work. What true disciples of Christ do is to grow in their faith and produce fruits of righteousness, made holy and preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord. This is what God calls us to, it is his work and, as St. Paul writes, he will also accomplish it. There should therefore be no difference between who we are and what we do. A poet named G.M. Hopkins wrote that everything in the universe cries out: "What I do is me: for that I came." This applies to John the Baptist, to Mary and—why not?—to us.

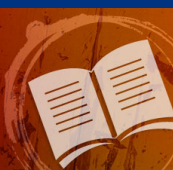

Christmas is a Holy Day of Obligation.



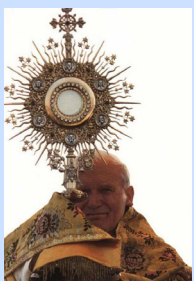
What's up with Christmas this Year?

Since Christmas Day falls on a Monday this year the Christmas Vigil happens to fall on the same day as the Fourth Sunday of Advent. This could possibly cause some uncertainty as to attending Masses over the weekend. To fulfill the obligation of attending Masses a Catholic must attend both the regular Sunday Mass (4th Sunday of Advent) and a Mass for Christmas. This presents the following combinations for attending Masses:

- **4th Sunday of Advent:** Attend on Saturday (Vigil) — **Christmas:** Attend on Sunday (Vigil)
- **4th Sunday of Advent:** Attend on Saturday (Vigil) — **Christmas:** Attend on Monday
- **4th Sunday of Advent:** Attend on Sunday — **Christmas:** Attend on Monday
- **4th Sunday of Advent:** Attend on Sunday — **Christmas:** Attend on Sunday (Vigil)

In the last case of attending both Masses on the same day, since each Mass is for a different liturgical celebration a Catholic is allowed to receive Communion twice in one day.

Please also note that there will be no 5pm Mass on December 24th for the 4th Sunday of Advent.

SYNOD ON YOUTH CONSULTATION EXTENDED UNTIL 12/31/2017...

In October 2017, after receiving feedback from 102 dioceses, 25 national organizations, and several USCCB committees, Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, Archbishop of Galveston-Houston and President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, sent a national summary report to Rome in advance of the Synod on "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment." The diocesan and organizational reports were also sent to Rome. For more about the Synod process, go to www.usccb.org/synod-2018.



In addition, Pope Francis has announced that the deadline for participating in the Vatican's Online Survey For Young People (ages 16-29) will be extended until December 31, 2017. We encourage all youth and young adults in the area to fill out the Vatican survey so that your input can be factored into the Synod consultation process.

The Vatican Synod website is <http://youth.synod2018.va> (upon clicking on the link, young people can select either Spanish [ES], English [EN], or Italian [IT] in the upper right hand corner of the website's landing page).

All young people around the world are encouraged to participate in the online survey, regardless of their engagement with or practice of the Catholic faith. The input received will help to shape the working document for the Synod of Bishops.

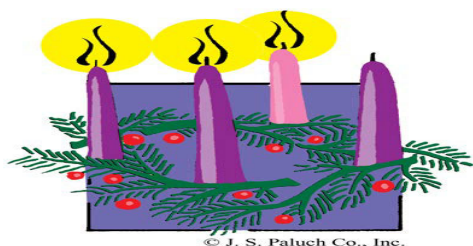

La Identidad

Tercer Domingo de Adviento: Isaías 61:1-11; 1 Tesalonicenses 5:16-24;

Juan 1:6-8,19-28

En su Magnificat (el salmo responsorial de hoy) María gozosamente se identifica como la servidora del Señor. Lo cual significa que ella comprendió su rol en el plan de Dios. Juan el Bautista se identifica como una Voz. El también sabía su rol, su lugar.

La Bella Señora de La Salette no se identificó de la misma manera, pero habló de su rol: "Estoy aquí para contarles una gran noticia" Por lo tanto, se identificó a sí misma, como la mensajera de Dios.

Isaías se describe con términos similares. El es enviado por Dios para traer novedades, para proclamar, para anunciar.

Lo que hacemos, sin embargo, no nos define completamente. Cuando San Pablo anima a los tesalonicenses a que se regocijen, se abstengan de hacer el mal, hay una realidad subyacente que explica el hacer, el rol, el comportamiento. Ellos son los discípulos de Jesucristo, por lo tanto viven de una determinada manera.

Ese es el mensaje de María en La Salette. La diferencia está en que San Pablo estaba animando a Cristianos que eran consientes de su identidad, en tanto Nuestra Señora estaba hablando a aquellos que habían perdido el sentido de la identidad cristiana, y cuyos comportamientos contradecían de muchas maneras dicha identidad.

La conversión, un volver, un retorno a la manera cristiana de vivir la vida, podría restaurar esa identidad. María promete que si su pueblo se convierte, sus campos volverán a producir con abundancia. Especulando un poco, esto sería como el cumplimiento de la profecía de Isaías: "Como el suelo echa sus brotes..., así el Señor hará brotar la justicia y las alabanzas ante todos los pueblos".

Lo que todas las plantas hacen, sin importar su especie, es crecer y producir fruto. Así las hizo Dios y así ellas hacen la obra de Dios. Lo que hacen los verdaderos discípulos de Cristo es crecer en su fe y producir frutos de justicia, se santifican y perseveran en pureza hasta la venida de nuestro Señor. Esto es lo que Dios nos llama a hacer, esta es su obra, como San Pablo escribe, El cumplirá sus promesas,

Por lo tanto no debe haber diferencia entre lo que somos y lo que hacemos. Un poeta llamado G.M. Hopkins escribió que todo en el universo clama: "Lo que hago soy: para eso vine" Esto se aplica a Juan el Bautista y – ¿por qué no? – a nosotros.

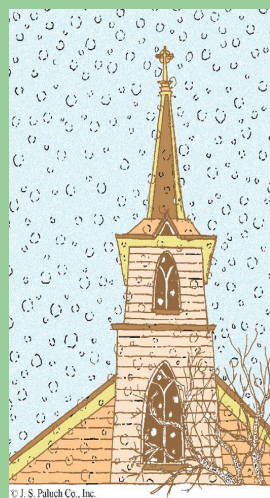

El día 16 de diciembre comienza la Novena de Aguinaldos en Colombia y otras partes de Latinoamérica. La novena consiste en 9 partes que se repiten por 9 noches:

Los participantes buscan aguinaldo (regalo). Para esto los colombianos tienen la costumbre de jugar "pajita en boca" buscando quien no trae una pajita en boca. La persona que no pueda mostrar que trae pajita en boca tiene que dar un regalo a quien lo descubrió. Los aguinaldos son recuerdo del regalo que nos dio Dios en su Hijo Jesús, prenda de su amor. Y si Dios nos da un aguinaldo tan grande es porque Dios no tiene pajita en boca cuando nos dice que nos ama.

En el corazón de la Novena está el refrán de Gozos:
