Twentieth-third Sunday of Ordinary Sunday

(Ezekiel 33:7-9; Romans 13:8-10; Matthew 18:15-20)

Maternal Admonition—In today's Gospel, Jesus foresees that conflicts will inevitably arise between members of his Church.

His first concern is that the matter be resolved peacefully. It must not be allowed to fester, leading to serious divisions that might spread into the community.

It is equally important, however, that the issue be kept within the Church. In 1 Corinthians 6, St. Paul complains about believers bringing cases to civil courts: "Can it be that there is not one among you wise enough to be able to settle a case between brothers? But rather brother goes to court against brother, and that before unbelievers?"

Many religious communities have (or had) an exercise called "fraternal admonition." In pairs or small groups, members point out one another's failings. Ideally, each would take the comments to heart with gratitude and strive to improve oneself.

Some might even be called to a more prophetic stance, especially if they believe that the community itself is in danger of going astray. Like Ezekiel, they feel a personal responsibility to challenge others.

The hard thing in all this is to be faithful to the commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." We ought to behave towards one another without giving or taking offense, and with no hardening of the heart. Then the issue of reconciliation does not arise.

However, since the Church is made up of real persons, occasional conflict will arise, ranging anywhere from strong differences of opinion to serious accusations of wrongdoing. The first condition for reconciliation that it be genuinely desired by both parties.

What does any of this have to do with La Salette, one might ask? A great deal. Mary addressed herself to a people absorbed with their own troubles and blaming God. They had so lost sight of Christ, that reconciliation did not even occur to them.

It took a Beautiful Lady, speaking in prophetic terms, to make them see that reconciliation was desirable and achievable. Through her tears, she offered a maternal admonition, giving us a model of the truly reconciling heart.

All are welcome and encouraged to bring flowers to lay at our "I Will Never Forget You" statue in a special ceremony immediately following the Mass.



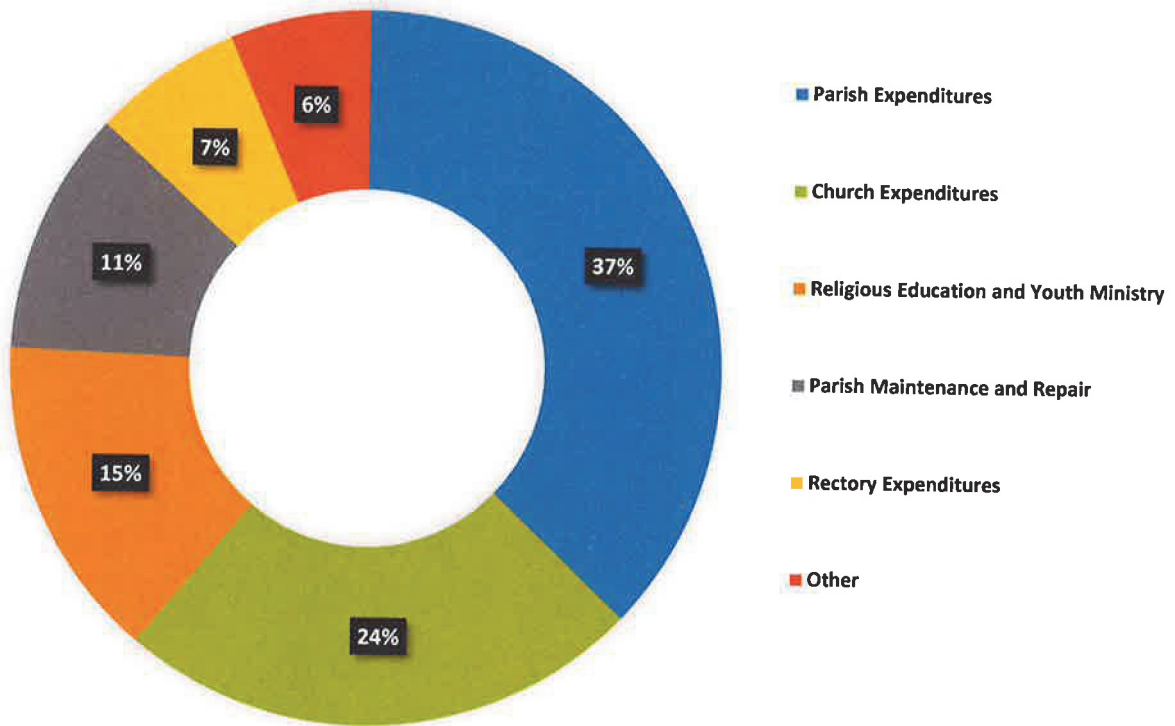

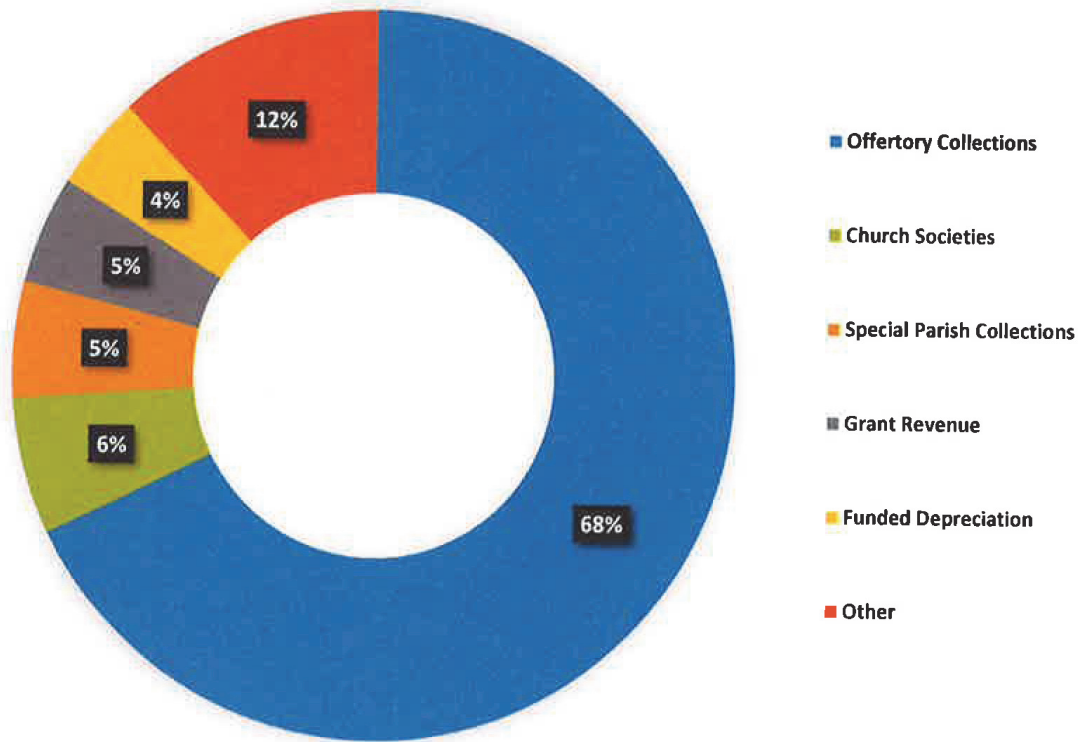
Fiscal Year 2019 - 2020 Expenditures

Fiscal Year 2019 - 2020 Contributions



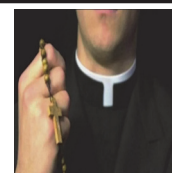

REFLEXION**Corrección Maternal**

Vigésimo Tercer Domingo Ordinario: Ezequiel 33:7-9; Romanos 13:8-10; Mateo 18:15-20

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús prevé que inevitablemente surgirán conflictos entre los miembros de su Iglesia. Su primera preocupación es que los asuntos puedan ser resueltos pacíficamente. Hay que evitar conflictos mayores, que desemboquen en serias divisiones que pudieran esparcirse dentro de la comunidad

Es igualmente importante, sin embargo, que los asuntos sean mantenidos al interior de la Iglesia. En 1 Corintios 6, San Pablo se queja de los creyentes que llevan los casos a las cortes civiles: “¡Por lo visto, no hay entre ustedes ni siquiera un hombre sensato, que sea capaz de servir de árbitro entre sus hermanos! ¿Un hermano pleitea con otro, y esto, delante de los que no creen?”

Muchas comunidades religiosas tienen (o tenían) un ejercicio llamado “corrección fraterna”; en pares o en pequeños grupos, los miembros se señalan las fallas los unos a los otros. Cada uno debía tomarse en serio las palabras del otro con gratitud y esforzarse por mejorar.

Algunos podrían hasta ser llamados a tener una postura más profética, especialmente si creen que la propia comunidad está en peligro de perder el rumbo. Como Ezequiel, sienten una responsabilidad personal de desafiar a los otros.

Lo más difícil en todo esto es mantenerse fiel al mandamiento, “Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo”. Debemos comportarnos ante los demás sin causar ofensa ni ofendernos, y sin dureza de corazón. Actuando así, la reconciliación no surgirá como un tema.

Sin embargo, ya que la Iglesia está formada por personas reales, surgirán conflictos ocasionales, que van desde grandes diferencias de opinión a serias acusaciones de mal comportamiento. La primera condición para la reconciliación es que haya un deseo genuino de ambas partes.

¿Qué tiene que ver todo esto con La Salette, uno podría preguntarse? Bastante. María se acercó a un pueblo absorto en sus propios problemas y culpando a Dios por ello. Un pueblo que había perdido de vista a Cristo, tanto que la reconciliación ni siquiera se les cruzaba por la mente.

Hacía falta una Bella Señora, hablando en términos proféticos, para hacerles ver que la reconciliación era deseable y alcanzable. Por medio de sus lágrimas, ella nos ofreció una corrección advertencia maternal, dándonos el modelo de un corazón que desea verdaderamente la reconciliación.

SAN PEDRO CLAVER (1581-1654)

9 de septiembre

Nació en la región de Cataluña, España. Siendo joven estudió en la Universidad de Barcelona, dirigida por los padres jesuitas. En 1602 fue admitido por los Jesuitas y profesó sus primeros votos. Luego de su noviciado se formó bajo la dirección de san Alfonso Rodríguez, quien fue para él un verdadero maestro y modelo de santidad. Luego de estudiar teología es enviado a la actual Colombia, donde fue ordenado sacerdote y quedó marcado profundamente al ver cómo trataban a los esclavos africanos traídos de Angola, en una travesía marítima que duraba hasta ocho semanas. No sólo era la trata de esclavos, sino las condiciones tan deplorables en que llegaban a Colombia. Él, sin hablar el idioma, se apresuraba a recibirlos ofreciéndoles medicina, pan y un trato digno. Solía decir que “antes de hablarles con los labios había que hablarles con las manos”. Se convirtió en un servidor y protector de ellos, llamándose a sí mismo: “esclavo de los esclavos”. Fue un apóstol incansable pues se preocupó de su bienestar espiritual así como de que se practicara la justicia hacia ellos.

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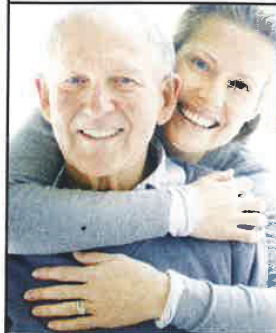
