Let Your Light Shine

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Ezekiel 34:11-17; 1 Corinthians 14:20-28; Matthew 25:31-46)

Works of Mercy—For three weeks now the Gospels have pointed to a moment of judgment, using a different standard in each case. Two weeks ago it was readiness for Christ's return; last week it was resourcefulness in his service; today it is the works of mercy.

A king on his throne is at the top of the social hierarchy. Christ our king, however, identifies himself with “these least ones,” those at the margins of society. Serving him must include reaching out to them.

The Church teaches that, besides feeding the hungry, we must work to eliminate the underlying causes of hunger. This principle applies to every work of mercy we can imagine, whether “corporal” or “spiritual.” It often requires the courage to speak unwelcome truths.

Mary at La Salette, not forgetting that she was a lowly servant, identified with “these least ones” in her choice of witnesses. She offered a remedy for the spiritual causes of her people’s bodily sufferings, by speaking the truth about their lack of faith in and reverence for her Son, Christ the King.

The goal of reconciliation is to restore peace; this is a appealing and comforting thought. The work of reconciliation, on the other hand, as exemplified by the Beautiful Lady, is not easy. It calls for gentle firmness. This can be a challenge.

In the rite of baptism, the anointing with sacred chrism unites us symbolically with Christ as Priest, Prophet and King. This means we share his role of guiding, leading, and protecting his flock, of caring for his people. How we do this depends on many factors, including our personality, our talents, and our most deeply held values.

If nothing else, most of us can try to lead by example—speaking truth and acting rightly, in such a way as to attract others to do the same.

At the same time, the spotlight is not on ourselves. Whatever form our works of mercy might take, they are never a performance. Jesus is at the center, and at the beginning, and at the end. If we can serve as channels of his truth and love, we need never fear the coming judgment.




Thanksgiving Day Mass



REFLEXION

Las Obras de Misericordia

Cristo Rey: Ezequiel 34:11-17; 1 Corintios 14:20-28; Mateo 25:31-46

Ya hace tres semanas que los Evangelios han ido resaltando instancias de juicio, usando diferentes estándares en cada caso. Hace dos semanas se trataba de estar preparados para el retorno de Cristo; la semana pasada se hablaba de ser creativos en el servicio del Señor; para hoy tenemos las obras de misericordia.

Un rey en su trono está al tope de la jerarquía social. Cristo es nuestro rey, sin embargo, se identifica a si mismo con los más pequeños. Aquellos que están al margen de la sociedad. Estar a su servicio incluye acercarse a ellos.

La Iglesia enseña que, además de dar de comer al hambriento, debemos trabajar para eliminar las causas subyacentes del hambre. Este principio se aplica a cada obra de misericordia que podamos imaginar, ya sean las "corporales" o las "espirituales". Esto muchas veces requiere del coraje de decir cosas inconvenientes.

María en La Salette, sin olvidar que ella es una humilde servidora, se identifica con los más pequeños, al elegir a sus testigos. Ella ofreció un remedio para la causa del sufrimiento físico de su pueblo. Diciendo la verdad acerca de la falta de fe y de reverencia por su Hijo, Cristo Rey.

La meta de la reconciliación es restaurar la paz; es un pensamiento atrayente y reconfortante. La obra de la reconciliación, por otro lado, como es exemplificado por la Bella Señora, no es fácil. Requiere de una firme suavidad. Puede ser un desafío.

En el rito del bautismo, la unción con el santo crisma nos une simbólicamente con Cristo como Sacerdote, Profeta y Rey. Esto quiere decir que compartimos su rol de guiar, liderar y proteger a su rebaño, cuidar a su pueblo. La manera en que lo hacemos depende de muchos factores que incluyen nuestra personalidad, nuestros talentos, y nuestros valores más profundos.

Al menos, la mayoría de nosotros puede tratar de guiar con el ejemplo – diciendo la verdad y actuando correctamente, de tal modo que otros se sientan atraídos a hacer lo mismo.

Al mismo tiempo, el centro de atención no está en nosotros. Cualquiera sea la forma que puedan tomar nuestras obras de misericordia, nunca son una puesta en escena. Jesús está al centro, y al principio, y al final. Si podemos servir como canales de su verdad y de su amor, no necesitamos temer el juicio venidero.

SANTA CECILIA (Siglo II) — 22 de noviembre

Santa Cecilia es la patrona de los músicos, pero antes de cantar, su vida toda fue un canto para Dios. Nació en Roma y desde muy joven prometió entregarse a Dios y permanecer casta. Su padre no pensó así y la obligó a casarse con un no cristiano llamado Valeriano, quien no sólo respetó su voluntad, sino que también se hizo cristiano. Fue él mismo quien convirtió a su hermano Tiburcio, para luego, ser martirizados ante su negativa de adorar a los dioses de Roma. Al ver la manera heroica en que morían, Máximo, un cortesano se convirtió al cristianismo y también lo martirizaron. Cecilia dio sepultura cristiana a los tres, acción que le valió la reprensión y el juicio frente al Prefecto Almaquio, quien al ver que no desistía de su fe mandó que la quemaran en el baño de su casa, pero el fuego no le hizo nada. Después, mandó que la decapitaran y luego de golpearla en el cuello, agonizó durante tres días hasta que entregó su espíritu. Fue sepultada en las catacumbas de san Calixto.


