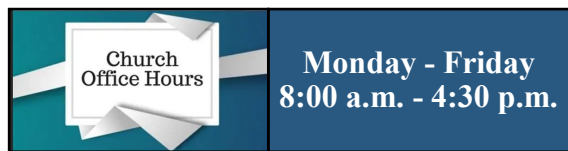

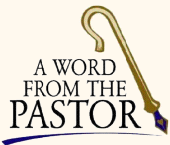

Competing Desires

Amid the anxieties of life, the Lord invites us to seek him in the stillness of our heart

I HAVE TO ADMIT IT: I felt some anxiety during last month's papal election. Perhaps I had listened to too many pundits and the election seemed unpredictable. When I heard there was "white smoke," I turned on my TV. Sitting alone and waiting to learn the result, I realized that I needed to be with others. So I walked across the street to my office building where, before long, 40 or 50 people gathered to watch and wait.

When the announcement was made, my anxiety dissipated, and I rejoiced. Pope Leo was an inspired choice. But there was still much to do - drafting a public statement, doing media interviews, celebrating a Mass of thanksgiving, and more. In the mean-time, calls and emails from friends and coworkers came pouring in.

By day's end, I was tired and thought I'd sleep soundly. But after a few hours, I awakened, still keyed up. I knew I had to center myself. I knew I needed my daily Holy Hour more than ever. There were just too many competing thoughts, questions and desires welling up in my mind and heart. I needed to be quiet and calm.

The next morning, sitting in the chapel of my residence, I was tempted to check out what was being said about Pope Leo. Meanwhile, I continued to receive many email and text messages. But with God's grace, I put it all aside. It was high time to shut it all down and enter into the Lord's presence. Sitting there in silence, I understood that competing worries and desires were overwhelming the one thing I should desire the most - to enter into the Lord's presence, to place myself, my ministry, my life, and my Church in the hands of the One who loves us most and loves us best. In a word, I needed solitude and prayer.

Quiet prayer is not merely a technique for overcoming anxiety, nor a way to acquire a stiff upper lip that masks one's true feelings. In prayer, we lay at God's feet all that roils us and all the desires that compete for our attention. Even while at prayer, we may often find ourselves fighting distractions and the same desires that beguile us all day long. When that happens, I find it helpful to repeat a simple phrase from Psalm 62: "*My soul, be at rest in God alone.*"

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches us to go into our "inner room" to pray (6:6). The room Jesus refers to is our heart and soul, that place where we are alone with God (cf. *Gaudium et Spes*, 16). While warning us against making a public display of our piety, Jesus urges us to pray in secret because he also knows we need a sanctuary, a place of refuge. When a hurricane or tornado is approaching, we're told to go to a safe place in the house, like a small interior room or hallway. Our inner self should be like that: a place where we can shelter, if only briefly, from life's stormy weather - the storms that hit us from the outside and the ones we ourselves generate.

To be clear, retreating into our inner room, quieting our soul and resting in the Lord, is not an avoidance technique - a way of hiding out or shirking responsibility. Rather, when we quiet our souls and ask for the grace to desire God alone, then we gain the wisdom to evaluate those competing desires that come our way, to sort out which are of God and which are not. As the peace of Christ takes root in us and our trust in God's love and compassion increases, we find the courage to take a good, honest look at ourselves. We begin to see ourselves as God sees us and others may see us.

My former seminary rector, the late Archbishop Harry J. Flynn, used to say: "Give me an hour before the Blessed Sacrament and eight hours of sleep, and I'll do anything the Church asks of me." That's good advice, don't you think? †

Deseos en competencia

En medio de las ansiedades de la vida, el Señor nos invita a buscarlo en la quietud del corazón (Por el Capellán Supremo Arzobispo William E. Lori)

Debo admitirlo: sentí algo de ansiedad durante la elección papal del mes pasado. Tal vez había escuchado demasiados comentarios de analistas, y la elección parecía impredecible. Cuando supe que había “humo blanco”, encendí el televisor. Sentado solo, esperando conocer el resultado, me di cuenta de que necesitaba estar con otras personas. Así que crucé la calle hacia mi oficina, donde, al poco tiempo, se reunieron entre 40 y 50 personas para ver la tv y esperar.

Cuando se hizo el anuncio, mi ansiedad desapareció, y me llené de alegría. El Papa León fue una elección inspiradora. Pero aún había mucho por hacer: redactar una declaración pública, conceder entrevistas, celebrar una Misa de acción de gracias, entre otras cosas. Mientras tanto, llamadas y correos de amigos y colegas no dejaban de llegar.

Al final del día, estaba cansado y pensé que dormiría profundamente. Pero después de unas pocas horas, me desperté, aún agitado. Sabía que necesitaba centrarme. Sabía que más que nunca necesitaba mi Hora Santa diaria. Había demasiados pensamientos, preguntas y deseos compitiendo en mi mente y corazón. Necesitaba tranquilidad y calma.

A la mañana siguiente, sentado en la capilla de mi residencia, tuve la tentación de revisar lo que se decía sobre el Papa León. Al mismo tiempo, seguía recibiendo muchos correos y mensajes. Pero con la gracia de Dios, dejé todo eso a un lado. Era momento de apagarlo todo y entrar en la presencia del Señor. Sentado en silencio, comprendí que las preocupaciones y deseos en competencia estaban abrumando el único deseo que realmente debería tener: entrar en la presencia del Señor, ponerme a mí mismo, mi ministerio, mi vida y mi Iglesia en las manos de Aquel que más nos ama y mejor nos ama. En una palabra, necesitaba soledad y oración.

La oración en silencio no es simplemente una técnica para superar la ansiedad, ni un modo de adquirir una actitud estoica que oculte los verdaderos sentimientos. En la oración, dejamos a los pies de Dios todo lo que nos inquieta y todos los deseos que compiten por nuestra atención. Incluso mientras oramos, a menudo luchamos contra distracciones y los mismos deseos que nos acechan todo el día. Cuando eso sucede, encuentro útil repetir una frase sencilla del Salmo 62: *“Solo en Dios descansa mi alma.”*

En el Evangelio de Mateo, Jesús nos enseña a entrar en nuestra “habitación interior” para orar (6:6). Esa habitación de la que Jesús habla es nuestro corazón y alma, ese lugar donde estamos a solas con Dios (cf. *Gaudium et Spes*, 16). Jesús nos advierte contra hacer un espectáculo público de nuestra piedad, pero también nos insta a orar en secreto porque sabe que necesitamos un santuario, un refugio. Cuando se acerca un huracán o tornado, se nos dice que vayamos a un lugar seguro de la casa, como una pequeña habitación interior o un pasillo. Nuestro interior debe ser como eso: un lugar donde podamos refugiarnos, aunque sea brevemente, de las tormentas de la vida, tanto las que vienen de afuera como las que nosotros mismos generamos.

Para ser claros, retirarse a nuestra habitación interior, aquietar el alma y descansar en el Señor no es una forma de evasión ni de evitar nuestras responsabilidades. Más bien, cuando aquietamos nuestra alma y pedimos la gracia de desear solo a Dios, entonces recibimos la sabiduría para discernir entre los deseos que vienen de Dios y los que no. A medida que la paz de Cristo echa raíces en nosotros y nuestra confianza en el amor y la compasión de Dios crece, encontramos el valor de mirarnos con honestidad. Comenzamos a vernos como Dios nos ve y como los demás pueden vernos.

Mi antiguo rector en el seminario, el difunto Arzobispo Harry J. Flynn, solía decir: “Dame una hora ante el Santísimo y ocho horas de sueño, y haré lo que sea que la Iglesia me pida.” Buen consejo, ¿no les parece? †

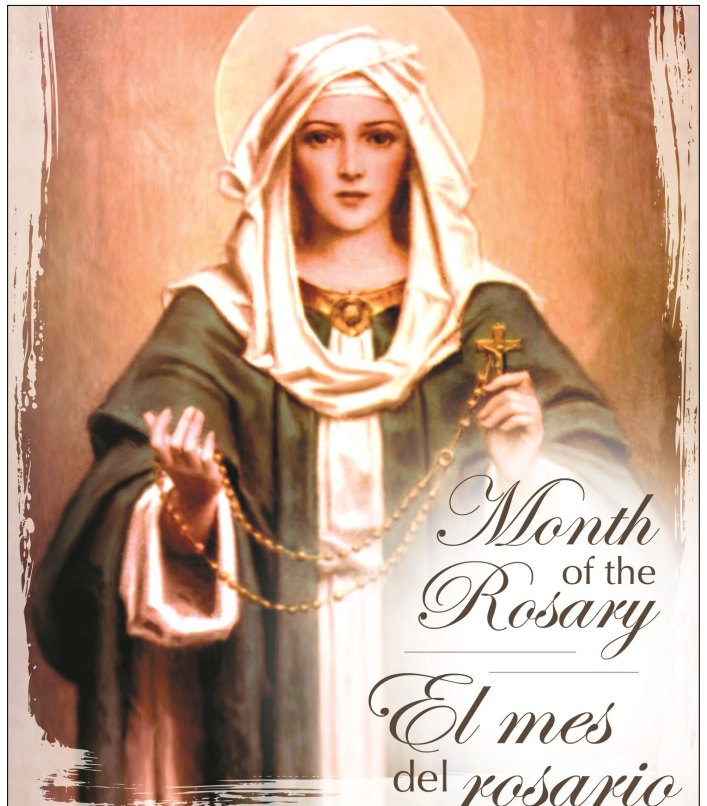

Discovering Our Vocation: God's Call for Every Heart

Every person is created by God with a unique purpose. This divine purpose—our vocation—is more than just a career or a role in society. It is the way we respond to God's love and live out our call to holiness. The Catechism reminds us: *"Love is the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being"* (CCC 2392).

At its heart, vocation is about listening and responding. God speaks to us in prayer, in Scripture, through the Church, and in the everyday experiences of life. Whether through a gentle nudge in prayer, the encouragement of a friend, or the stirring of our own desires to serve, the Lord is always inviting us to draw closer and to discover His plan.

The Church recognizes several primary ways of living out this call:

- **Marriage** – A covenant of love where spouses mirror Christ's love for the Church and raise families rooted in faith.
- **Priesthood and Diaconate** – A life of sacramental service, preaching, and shepherding God's people.
- **Consecrated Life** – Religious brothers, sisters, and consecrated persons who witness to the kingdom of God by vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience.
- **Single Life** – A generous life of service and holiness, dedicated to God and others in unique ways.

Each vocation is vital to the life of the Church. When we answer God's call, we bring joy to our own lives and help build up the Body of Christ.

Discerning a vocation requires patience, openness, and trust. It is not about having all the answers immediately, but about taking one step at a time with the Lord. We can support one another in this journey by creating a culture of prayer, encouragement, and openness to God's will.

As a parish family, let us pray in a special way for more young men and women to respond generously to God's call to priesthood and religious life. At the same time, let us support and strengthen marriages, single people, and all who strive daily to live their vocation faithfully.

May each of us have the courage to say, like the prophet Isaiah: *"Here I am, Lord; send me!"* (Isaiah 6:8).

Descubriendo Nuestra Vocación: El Llamado de Dios para Cada Corazón

Cada persona ha sido creada por Dios con un propósito único. Este propósito divino—nuestra vocación—es mucho más que una carrera o un papel en la sociedad. Es la manera en que respondemos al amor de Dios y vivimos nuestra llamada a la santidad. El Catecismo nos recuerda: *"El amor es la vocación fundamental e innata de todo ser humano"* (CEC 2392).

En el fondo, la vocación se trata de escuchar y responder. Dios nos habla en la oración, en la Sagrada Escritura, a través de la Iglesia y en las experiencias cotidianas de la vida. Ya sea con un suave impulso en la oración, con el ánimo de un amigo o con el deseo interior de servir, el Señor siempre nos invita a acercarnos más y a descubrir su plan.

La Iglesia reconoce varias formas principales de vivir este llamado:

- **Matrimonio** – Una alianza de amor en la que los esposos reflejan el amor de Cristo por la Iglesia y crían a sus familias en la fe.
- **Sacerdocio y Diaconado** – Una vida de servicio sacramental, de predicación y de cuidado pastoral del pueblo de Dios.
- **Vida Consagrada** – Hermanos, hermanas y personas consagradas que dan testimonio del Reino de Dios mediante los votos de pobreza, castidad y obediencia.
- **Vida Laical Soltera** – Una vida generosa de servicio y santidad, dedicada a Dios y a los demás de maneras únicas.

Cada vocación es vital para la vida de la Iglesia. Cuando respondemos al llamado de Dios, llevamos alegría a nuestra propia vida y ayudamos a edificar el Cuerpo de Cristo.

Discernir una vocación requiere paciencia, apertura y confianza. No se trata de tener todas las respuestas de inmediato, sino de dar un paso a la vez junto al Señor. Podemos apoyarnos mutuamente en este camino creando una cultura de oración, aliento y apertura a la voluntad de Dios.

Como familia parroquial, recemos de manera especial para que más jóvenes respondan generosamente al llamado de Dios al sacerdocio y a la vida religiosa. Al mismo tiempo, apoyemos y fortalezcamos los matrimonios, las personas solteras y a todos los que cada día se esfuerzan por vivir fielmente su vocación.

Que cada uno de nosotros tenga el valor de decir, como el profeta Isaías: *"Aquí estoy, Señor, envíame"* (Isaías 6:8).

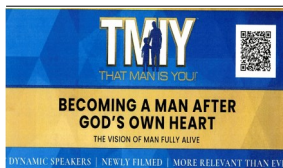

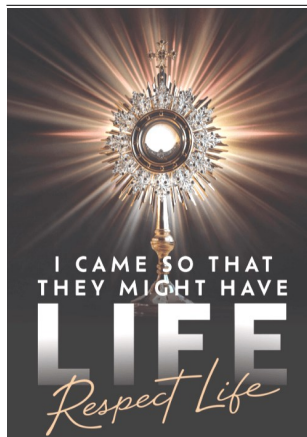
