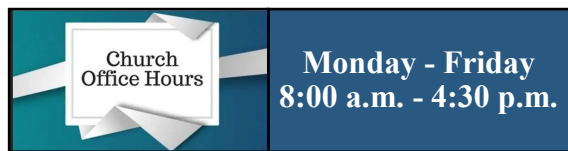

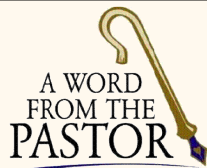

“We are pilgrims, and the whole of life is but a journey.” (St Augustine)

It is the First Sunday of Lent, and once again we step out upon a journey — much like a holy pilgrimage. We begin traveling a sacred but narrow pathway, one with a definite beginning and a glorious ending: the Solemnity of the Resurrection of the Lord, Jesus Christ.

The Church presents us with the traditional number of **forty days and forty nights**. In Sacred Scripture, forty is a symbolic number. It signifies a long and purposeful period of testing, preparation, purification, and transformation. Jesus spent forty days in the desert before facing the temptations of the devil in today’s Gospel. The Hebrews wandered forty years in the desert before entering the Promised Land. In the former liturgical calendar, the Risen Lord appeared for forty days before His Ascension into glory.

Sacred journeys — like Lent — are always meant to take us to a “better place” by God’s grace and our full participation. Through prayer, acts of penance, sacrifice, and generous love, we are invited to ongoing conversion of heart.

In the coming Sundays, we will hear familiar and powerful Gospel narratives:

- The temptations of Jesus in the desert.
- The Transfiguration — a radiant glimpse of Christ’s divine glory offered after the troubling predictions of His suffering and death.
- The conversion of the Samaritan woman at the well.
- The healing of the man born blind in the Temple.
- The raising of Lazarus, the dear friend of Jesus and brother of Martha and Mary.

Each of these moments challenges us to rediscover promise, hope, and fulfillment in Christ.

This Lent we are called to deepen our conviction that Jesus is truly the Savior of the world — our Wonder-Counselor, Prince of Peace, and God-hero revealed from the manger to the Cross. He is Emmanuel, *God-with-us*, who never abandons His people. He remains faithful even when we falter. And He pours out His Holy Spirit so that we may live in communion with Him now and forever.

Today’s Gospel presents the three temptations of Jesus, and in them we see reflections of our own struggles:

- 1) **The temptation of self-sufficiency** — to live as if we have no needs, no hunger, no dependence on God. Jesus reminds us that “one does not live on bread alone,” but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.
- 2) **The temptation to test God** — to demand proof of His care and providence. We are called instead to trust in the Father’s faithful love, even when we cannot see or know the outcome.
- 3) **The temptation of power and possession** — the illusion that we can claim the kingdoms of this world, that we can “be like God,” as Eve and Adam were tempted to believe. Only God gives the Kingdom. It is received as gift, not seized as achievement.

Jesus, fully divine and fully human — like us in all things but sin — shows us that temptation and struggle are not signs of failure, but part of the journey. Through obedience, sacrifice, and unwavering trust in the Father, He reveals the path of true discipleship.

As sons and daughters of God, we too will struggle. We will be asked to sacrifice. At times the path may seem difficult. But with bold faith and conviction, we accept our vocation as faithful followers — **servant-disciples** sharing in the same mission and ministry of Christ within His Church.

So let us not fear to take the first steps once again. Lent is not merely about what we give up — it is about what we allow God to transform within us. Our arrival at Easter will open us to new possibilities, new beginnings, and deeper union with the Risen Lord.

As we begin this sacred season, let us hold fast to the words of Scripture:

“Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, rich in kindness, and relenting in punishment.” (Joel 2:13)

May this Lenten pilgrimage lead us ever closer to the heart of Jesus and the joy of His Resurrection, while reminding us that discipleship is not about ease, but about holiness, courage, and fidelity to Christ.

“We were not made for comfort; we were made for greatness.” (Pope Benedict XIV)

“Somos peregrinos, y toda la vida no es sino un viaje.” (San Agustín)

Es el Primer Domingo de Cuaresma y, una vez más, emprendemos un camino — como una santa peregrinación. Comenzamos a recorrer un camino sagrado pero estrecho, con un inicio claro y un final glorioso: la Solemnidad de la Resurrección del Señor, Jesucristo.

La Iglesia nos presenta el número tradicional de **cuarenta días y cuarenta noches**. En la Sagrada Escritura, el cuarenta es un número simbólico. Significa un largo y decidido tiempo de prueba, preparación, purificación y transformación. Jesús pasó cuarenta días en el desierto antes de enfrentar las tentaciones del diablo en el Evangelio de hoy. Los hebreos caminaron cuarenta años por el desierto antes de entrar en la Tierra Prometida. En el antiguo calendario litúrgico, el Señor Resucitado se apareció durante cuarenta días antes de su Ascensión a la gloria.

Los caminos sagrados — como la Cuaresma — siempre están destinados a llevarnos a un “lugar mejor” por la gracia de Dios y por nuestra plena participación. Mediante la oración, los actos de penitencia, el sacrificio y el amor generoso, somos invitados a una conversión continua del corazón.

En los próximos domingos escucharemos relatos evangélicos conocidos y poderosos:

- Las tentaciones de Jesús en el desierto.
- La Transfiguración — una mirada radiante de la gloria divina de Cristo ofrecido después de los inquietantes anuncios de su sufrimiento y muerte.
- La conversión de la mujer samaritana en el pozo.
- La sanación del hombre ciego de nacimiento en el Templo.
- La resurrección de Lázaro, querido amigo de Jesús y hermano de Marta y María.

Cada uno de estos momentos nos desafía a redescubrir la promesa, la esperanza y el cumplimiento en Cristo.

Esta Cuaresma estamos llamados a profundizar nuestra convicción de que Jesús es verdaderamente el Salvador del mundo — nuestro Consejero Admirable, Príncipe de la Paz y Dios-héroe revelado desde el pesebre hasta la Cruz. Él es Emmanuel, Dios-con-nosotros, que nunca abandona a su pueblo. Permanece fiel incluso cuando nosotros fallamos. Y derrama su Espíritu Santo para que vivamos en comunión con Él ahora y para siempre.

El Evangelio de hoy presenta las tres tentaciones de Jesús, y en ellas vemos reflejadas nuestras propias luchas:

- 1) **La tentación de la autosuficiencia** — vivir como si no tuviéramos necesidades, hambre o dependencia de Dios. Jesús nos recuerda que “no solo de pan vive el hombre”, sino de toda palabra que sale de la boca de Dios.
- 2) **La tentación de poner a prueba a Dios** — exigir pruebas de su cuidado y providencia. Estamos llamados, en cambio, a confiar en el amor fiel del Padre, incluso cuando no podemos ver ni conocer el resultado.
- 3) **La tentación del poder y la posesión** — la ilusión de que podemos adueñarnos de los reinos de este mundo, que podemos “ser como Dios”, como fueron tentados Eva y Adán. Solo Dios concede el Reino. Se recibe como don, no se arrebató como logro.

Jesús, plenamente divino y plenamente humano — semejante a nosotros en todo menos en el pecado — nos muestra que la tentación y la lucha no son signos de fracaso, sino parte del camino. Mediante la obediencia, el sacrificio y la confianza inquebrantable en el Padre, revela el sendero del verdadero discipulado.

Como hijos e hijas de Dios, nosotros también lucharemos. Se nos pedirá sacrificio. A veces el camino puede parecer difícil. Pero con fe valiente y firme convicción, aceptamos nuestra vocación como seguidores fieles — discípulos servidores que comparten la misma misión y ministerio de Cristo dentro de su Iglesia.

Así que no temamos dar los primeros pasos una vez más. La Cuaresma no se trata solo de lo que dejamos — sino de lo que permitimos que Dios transforme en nosotros. Nuestra llegada a la Pascua nos abrirá a nuevas posibilidades, nuevos comienzos y una unión más profunda con el Señor Resucitado.

Al comenzar este tiempo sagrado, aferrémonos a las palabras de la Escritura:

“Vuelvan al Señor su Dios, porque Él es compasivo y misericordioso, lento a la ira y rico en bondad, y se arrepiente del castigo.” (Joel 2:13)

Que esta peregrinación cuaresmal nos acerque cada vez más al corazón de Jesús y a la alegría de su Resurrección, recordándonos que el discipulado no se trata de comodidad, sino de santidad, valentía y fidelidad a Cristo.

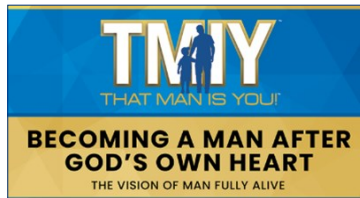
