The Family Faith Formation program at Blessed Trinity Parish is dedicated to providing adults, youth, and children with the knowledge, experiences and skills necessary to become faithful and fruitful disciples of Jesus.

In keeping with their age, they will assume responsibility as vital members of the parish and be able to participate in the Church's mission to proclaim, celebrate and serve.

Admissions/Registration

REGISTRATION POLICY

Families must be registered in the Parish in order to enroll their children in Faith Formation. Those enrolling their children for the first time must provide a copy of each child's Baptism Certificate. Registrations for new students takes place in August 2023.

STATEMENT OF GENERAL EXPECTATIONS FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

It is expected that each family become actively involved in Blessed Trinity's Faith Formation Program and Parish in order to model a

living, conscious and active Christian faith, and to reinforce the values and attitudes for living that faith. The family and their children also agree to act in accordance with these values and attitudes. Failure of a family member to act in a truly Christian manner or cooperate fully with Blessed Trinity Parish may lead to the removal or non-registration of the family member participating in the Faith Formation Program.

CUSTODY ISSUES

If parents are divorced or separated a copy of the custody agreement pertaining to the Faith Formation of the child must be kept on file in the Faith Formation office.



FINANCES AND OTHER CONTRACTED FINANCES

Definitions – Pre-K –5th Grade Registration fees are as follows: \$65 for one child, \$60 for the second child, \$45 for third child and no fee after the third child. Edge(6, 7, 8th Grades) and LifeTeen (9th-12th Grades) 5\$ Processing Fee Plus DONATION. For the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation there is a fee of \$45 per child. These fees are used to purchase student textbooks, materials for retreats, as well as other classroom materials needed for class. If a family is unable to pay the registration fee for financial reasons, or needs to make payments, please contact the Parish Bookeeper, Dennis Beckwith, to make special arrangements.

Textbooks: Each student is issued a textbook for the year. Your child's catechist's will send home the chapter pages taught that day, every week. Please take sometime to go over the lesson with your child. If your child is absent you are responsible to cover the material they miss. Remember, you are their primary teachers of the Faith.

Discipline/Rules

Because the class time is limited, each catechist will set up simple classroom rules in order to maximize instructional time and minimize distractions. If consistent discipline issues occur with a student, parents will be contacted to discuss the situation and how to resolve it.

In order to provide the best learning environment for all students we ask that students <u>do not</u> bring cell phones, Ipods, handheld games, and other toys to Faith Formation. Our class time is limited and the catechists cannot afford any unnecessary distractions.

Attendance

Regular attendance at Religious Education classes is an important factor in deepening a child's understanding of our triune God through the study of Scripture, Prayer, Church teaching, and Community. If an absence is unavoidable please notify Mr. Louie by e-mail at lmurgia@btccorl.org. The catechist of your child's class will be notified. The material missed will be provided so that you can help your child review it before the next class.

Arrival and Dismissal

For your child's safety and protection, all students are to be taken to and picked up from their assigned classroom by one parent or person specifically authorized in writing by the parent(s). Students should be picked up promptly at the close of their class session. At dismissal time students will not walk to their cars. Pre-K through 5th grade children are to be signed in and signed out of their classrooms by parents. 6th-8th Grades must be signed out. The Religious Education program can only be responsible for students whose parents follow this dismissal policy.

No student is to be allowed to leave the Parish Center until the parent(s) or assigned person comes in for pickup. Older siblings will not be allowed to sign out younger siblings. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS.

Emergency Class Cancellation

As we look to the new year, we would like to make everyone aware of our class/meeting cancellation guidelines. Religious Education classes will generally be cancelled during any weather emergency, such as a hurricane, tornado, or severe weather conditions. Our primary concern is for the safety of our children and families.

Safety and Health

MEDICATION

Medicine is never dispensed by those in the parish Faith Formation
Program. If children require
medicine, parents come to the class



to dispense it themselves or to make other arrangements. Parents need to inform the Faith Formation Director and catechist of any special medical condition or needs of their child. All such information will be kept confidential.

FINGERPRINTING POLICY of the Diocese of Orlando has mandated that any adult or young adult (14 years or older) working with children must be fingerprinted and background checked. Therefore, only fingerprinted individuals will be allowed in the areas in which classes are being held. If you would like to be a hall monitor or classroom assistant, please contact the Faith Formation Assistant, Yliana Soto.

CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE AND PREVENTION

Every family is expected to read the "Child Sexual Abuse and Prevention Booklet" of the Diocese of Orlando. There is also a Safe Environment video online through the Diocesan website (www.orlandodiocese.org). Pursuant to state law, we are required to report suspected child abuse, and we will follow Diocesan policy on such matters.

CHILDREN'S ONLINE PRIVACY PROTECTION RULE Every family is expected to read the policy of the Diocese of Orlando on internet safety.

Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Parish Policy on Catechesis/Preparation

In accordance with Sacramental policies and guidelines approved by the Bishops of Florida, March 6, 2000 Sacramental Catechesis takes place in a parish based program.

- Registration for First Holy Communion Preparation takes place in Juneor August
- A copy of the participants baptism certificate is required to complete registration.
- Living the life of a practicing Catholic is normative and expected. This means parents and children participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church, which includes worshiping with the community (Sunday mass) each week.
- Blessed Trinity offers preparation for Reconciliation and Communion to children, in 2nd grade and higher. They must also attend regular Religious Education Class. Exception: Children/adolescents are enrolled and participating fully in Catholic school.
- Adults who have been baptized but never catechized may need the process of the RCIA.
- Children, adolescents, and adults must complete catechesis for the Sacrament of Reconciliation before beginning Preparation for First Holy Communion.
- Children, adolescents, parents, and adults must participate in the Advent and Lent Parish renewal on Reconciliation.
- There are two half-day sessions for Reconciliation (Fall) and three First Holy Communion (Spring) sessions which include prayer and age appropriate catechesis AND MASS PARTICIPATION. Full Participation is the norm and Mandatory. (see calendar)

Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Parish Policy on Catechesis/Preparation

- Missed sessions will be "made up" at a date given in the future. Sports, ETC... are NOT acceptable excuses for Formation Preparation on the TRUE PRESENCE OF JESUS
- Children/adolescents participate in the rehearsal.
- Following the Parish guidelines for the Day of First Holy Communion is expected/required.

CONFIRMATION Parish Policy on Catechesis/Preparation

In accordance with sacramental policies and guideline approved by the Bishops of Florida, March 6, 2000 sacramental catechesis takes place in a parish based program

- A copy of your baptism certificate is required before beginning preparation.
- Living the life of a practicing Catholic is normative and expected. This means full participation in the sacramental life of the Church, which includes participating in Mass with the community each Sunday.



Confirmation

- Children/adolescents must have a solid background in religious education before sacramental catechesis for confirmation (preparation) begins. This takes place through parish religious education or Catholic school.
- Candidates for Confirmation at Blessed Trinity do not begin immediate preparation for confirmation until they are 14 years old (must be fifteen on the day of Confirmation) and/or in 10th grade.
- Immediate preparation for Confirmation includes retreats, 7 sessions which involve prayer and catechesis, plus meetings with their sponsors between the sessions. They must also attend regular Religious Education Class. Exception: Children/adolescents are enrolled and participating fully in Catholic school. Full participation is the norm and Mandatory. Sports, ETC... are NOT acceptable excuses for Formation Preparation.
- Parents of adolescents are required to participate in an orientation session and the immediate preparation sessions.
- Parish sponsors of adolescents are required to participate in the orientation/training sessions, the immediate preparation sessions, and to meet with the adolescent they are sponsoring once between each preparation session using provided materials.
- Adults seeking Confirmation participate in the parish preparation process, which includes the immediate preparation sessions, meetings between sessions with their sponsor. Making a spiritual retreat during the time of preparation is expected. Both adolescents and adults are expected to continue a life of service through one of the ministries in the parish.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

These sessions are for those interested in becoming Catholic. Sessions are offered for:

- Children, Teenagers, and Adults who have never been baptized.
- Children, Teens, and Adults who were baptized in another Christian tradition and never catechized.

FULL COMMUNION CLASSES

- Children, Teens, and Adults who were baptized in another Christian tradition and have some knowledge of the faith.
- High school students who were baptized Catholic but never had instruction in the Catholic faith.

*Each situation is unique and people are placed based upon their specific needs.

Classes for RCIA meet on Sunday mornings beginning with Mass at 10AM and concluding around 12:30.

Communication

Parents will be notified about various activities of the program through flyers, bulletin announcements, texts, and email. Due to high cost in postage and shipping charges, the Faith Formation Office will be using *email addresses* as the primary means of communication. We will also send text messages with important reminders. It is required we have your cell number and phone carrier (ATT, Verizon...) in order to text you in the event of an emergency. Mailings and phone calls will be used only occasionally. We are here to serve the Religious Education needs of our children, youth, and adults. Curriculum

Preschool Formation (4 and 5 years old)

"Seeds" from Pflaum. Will teach young children about our Catholic faith. Familiarize children with the Catholic sacraments, liturgical rituals, symbols, and seasons. Help form children's moral lives, standards, and values. Teach children how to pray. Give children the words and tools they need to talk about God.

Elementary Formation (Grades 1-5)

The Word of Life series is published by Augustine Institute. The General Directory of Catechesis (no.226) states "Children thus perceive and joyously live the closeness of God and of Jesus made manifest by their parents." Simply put: Parents are the primary educators of their children. In order to accomplish this, parents are asked to attend Faith Formation once a month at the beginning of a new unit with their child. Teachers will still teach on Sundays, but parents will take a more active role in the catechism of their child.

We look forward to partnering with you to fulfil your Baptismal promise to raise your child in the faith of the Church.

Middle School Formation (Grades 6-8)

EDGE is a youth group gathering open to all 6th-8th grade students. During the school year, we meet in the Parish Center, 6:30pm until 8:00pm on Wednesday's throughout the school year from September-May, as well as select dates throughout the summer. We feed your body & soul! Food, faith and fun, guest speakers, hands-on activities, song, prayer, games, movies, personal reflection, and question and answer sessions. We share our lives and the stories of our own faith, doubts and triumphs.

High School Formation (Grades 9-12)

Any high school students currently attending grades 9-12, Catholics or non-Catholics are invited to attend our Life Teen program! We meet on Sundays throughout the calendar school year from September-May as well as select dates throughout the summer months! Make sure to follow us on Instagram & Facebook for the latest updates!

Expectations

Parents:

Faith and Spirituality are nurtured and grown within the family.

They will prepare and teach the designated curriculum incorporating multicultural and multiple intelligence insights into the many activities.
