Total Solar Eclipse

I'm sure you have heard of the solar eclipse that is taking place tomorrow, and the privilege we have of being very near to it. While here in Seattle we aren't in the 'path of totality', we are very close. I've heard estimates of as many as one million people expected in Oregon in order to see the total eclipse of the sun—roughly one fourth of the state's total population.

Some online bloggers see this eclipse as a sign from God indicating the end of the world. That is neither true, nor a particularly helpful line of thinking. I would suggest instead that this is specially graced opportunity to meditate on the complex beauty of creation and on the creator Himself.

I've always found the image of the moon reflecting the light of the sun as a useful metaphor for our lives as Christians. Like the moon, we are at our best when we simply reflect the light of the Son—s-O-n. In the same way, our world is darker when we block out the light of God by seeking only our own needs and

desires and caring only for ourselves. In our prayer this week, let's consider how God may be asking us to live for others, and where we can bring goodness and light to places in our circle of influence.

The eclipse will be on the news and likely the topic of many casual conversations this week. The bright light of the sun is too much for our human eyes to behold and requires special viewing devises. An astrophysicist, Ethan Siegel, said in Forbes Magazine that on a scale of 1—10 this eclipse during the moments of totality. is about a million. Well, let's not miss this opportunity.

This week will also see our school teachers back in the building preparing for our students to begin another year of learning and growing. Please pray for them in a special way this week. The start of the school year is always an exciting time filled with hope and joy, along with many responsibilities and deadlines.

Let's continue to pray for one another,
