Dear Friends,

This Wednesday we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a Holy Day of Obligation—one of only 5 days other than Sundays that we as Catholics are expected to attend Mass. Since people generally don't like to be told what to do, I know some people who prefer to call them 'Holy Days of Opportunity.'

January 1: Mary, Mother of God. May 10: Ascension Thursday August 15: Assumption of Mary November 1: All Saints Day December 8: Immaculate Conception

December 25: Christmas

The doctrine of the Assumption of Mary is relatively recent, established in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. However, the belief that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven at the end of her life is documented as early as the second and third centuries. There are scriptural references too, in both the old and new testaments, that resonate the sentiment and truth of the As-

sumption. Ponder the words of the angel who first appeared to Mary at the annunciation, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you, blessed are you among women". (Luke 1:28)

For me, it just seems fitting that the one chosen to carry Jesus in her womb would be given great honor—and in her Assumption she offers for us a glimpse of what awaits us at the end of our earthly life.
