

SCHOOL NEWS



Update On Return to Campus

It has been a very exciting week here on campus. Having our Kindergarten back in the building has, once again brought new life and additional joy into the building. With help from a wonderful group of volunteers, we tested out our drop-off and pick-up procedures and have adjusted so that we are ready and efficient when additional students return to campus. Unfortunately, there is new doubt as to when additional students will be returning.

As you may have already seen from this week's Key Indicators Data from King County, there has been a significant increase in transmission of COVID over the last week.

Yesterday, and again this morning, I spoke directly with a member of the King County Public Health Department. She reiterated that we do not need to shut down school or stop in-person instruction for those students already on campus. With the numbers where they are, public health is recommending that all schools slow down their reopening and they strongly urged schools not to bring back additional students to help avoid a complete shutdown of the school.

Based on the new numbers, our written policy, the recommendations from King County Public Health, and in conjunction with the other Catholic School principals in North Seattle; I have adjusted our reopening plan and we will not be adding new classes in the immediate future.

- Those students currently on campus (PS, PK, Kindergarten) will continue to receive in-person instruction until we are advised that it is no longer safe to have students in the building.
- Tentative return date for students in 1st and 2nd grade is now Monday, November 2nd.
- Tentative return date for students in 3rd and 4th grade is now Monday, November 9th.
- Tentative return date for student in 5th grade is now Monday, November 16th.
- Currently, we do not have a set return date for our Middle School students. We hope to welcome them to campus in November but, December 7th (the start of the 2nd trimester), may be a more realistic date of return.
