





Lent 2024 starts on **Ash Wednesday, February 14,** and lasts until the beginning of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Reflect on the Word of God and pray that our hearts may be open to encounter Jesus in all the ways he comes to us: in word, in sacrament and in all his people.




- Book Group meets on the 1st Thursday of every month, at 7:00 PM.


