

JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE TO ROME AND ASSISI: A JOURNEY OF FAITH AND HISTORY

Led by Fr. Parrish and Fr. Hilander, and joined by many parishioners from our Parish Family, a recent pilgrimage to Rome was a deeply spiritual and memorable experience.



Pilgrims brought prayer intentions from our Parish Family to a Papal Audience and celebrated Mass in the Vatican Grottoes, just steps from the tombs of Saints John Paul II and Benedict XVI, in a small, intimate chapel beneath St. Peter's Basilica.

Highlights included visits to the Vatican Museums, the Sistine Chapel, the Catacombs of Domitilla, and the ancient Basilica of San Clemente, where Christian worship has taken place since the first century. There, pilgrims were treated to a special archaeological tour by Fr. Paul Lawlor, a trained archaeologist and the Prior of the Dominican community at San Clemente, and celebrated Mass at the high altar with Fr. Augustine Hilander. Some of our own parishioners even had the honor of proclaiming the Word from the magnificent ambo. It was a grace-filled journey of faith, history, and community.

FAITH IN FOCUS



"And with Your Spirit"

SEVERAL TIMES during the Mass, the priest or deacon greets the people with "The Lord be with you" or a similar phrase. In English, congregations have responded, "And also with you," but a



closer translation of the Latin is, "And with your spirit." (Dominus vobiscum. Et cum spiritu tuo.) Most congregations speaking other languages have always answered with the equivalent of "And with your spirit."

The response is based on a phrase from the New Testament. St. Paul concludes four epistles with the desire that the grace of Jesus Christ will be with the spirit of the letters' recipients: Galatians 6:18, Philippians 4:23, 2 Timothy 4:22, and Philemon 25. Paul prays that Christ will inhabit their innermost being—their spirit.


At Mass, the words "The Lord be with you" express a wish, but the wish is already happening. The Lord is present with those who gather in his name. When the people respond, they say essentially the same thing. They wish that the Lord will be with the spirit—the innermost being—of the priest or deacon. Indeed, the Lord is present because of the sacredness of the minister and of the liturgical action underway.

In the Catholic liturgy, the greeting "The Lord be with you" is made only by a priest or deacon. Therefore, the response to the spirit of the minister may carry another meaning; it may also refer to the Holy Spirit who came upon the minister in his ordination. But at a simpler level, squarely on the basis of scriptural evidence, the response carries a message equivalent to the greeting. Both the minister and the people are wishing that the Lord will be with the other, and the Lord is present to them because of the purpose of their gathering

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Saint Peter Feast Day: June 29 Patron Saint of fishermen, net makers, and ship builders.





birth date remains uncertain, he is believed to have died in 64 AD. He was canonized by Christ as the "rock of the church" described in Matthew chapter 16, verse 18.

Saint Peter was born Simon Peter of Cephas. He was a fisherman who met Jesus while in his boat. He and his brother Andrew had been experiencing trouble catching fish but when Jesus saw the boats, he told them to cast their nets into deep water and He would fill them. Peter and his brother cast their nets and sure enough they caught so many fish their nets began to tear. By the time the nets had been emptied on board, the boats were nearly sinking. When Simon Peter realized what happened, he admitted he was a sinful man and Jesus told him, "from now on it is people you will be catching." Peter became one of Jesus' disciples that very day and was present for several miracles.

Following Christ's death, it was Peter who denied knowing Jesus three times before a rooster crowed twice and following the Resurrection, Jesus gave Peter three chances to make up for the denials by asking Peter if he loved Him. Each time Peter responded that he did love Jesus, and so he was resolved of his guilt. There are several stories of Peter's accomplishments following Jesus' ascension, including the story of how he escaped King Herod with help from an angel. Peter helped spread the Gospel to Gentiles, baptized people, and was eventually martyred. When he was to be crucified, he admitted he was not worthy of dying the same way Jesus did, and was crucified upside-down. Following his death, Peter was buried on Vatican Hill, where Emperor Constantine I honored him with a large basilica. In 1950, bone shards were discovered and Pope Paul the 6th announced they belonged to Peter.

On November 24, 2013, Pope Francis revealed the relics of nine bone fragments for the first time in public during a Mass celebrated at St. Peter's Square. Artwork featuring Saint Peter often depicts him as an elderly man holding a key and book, though his symbols also include an inverted cross, a boat, and a rooster.




Book Group




