



Exciting Changes

GREATER COLLABORATION, STEWARDSHIP, AND SHARED MISSION

Last weekend, Fr. Parrish shared some important updates about changes in our Parish Family operations. Read the full update here → <https://bit.ly/PF14Changes0925>.

Below is a brief overview of the changes and the support available to you during this transition.

Admin/Operations Team

- All the admin staff of the three parishes will be working for the Parish Family, NOT for their specific parish. For example, Teresa Gillett, formerly the Development Director of St. John, will now be the Development Director for the entire Parish Family.
- All admin staff, except Anita Hardwick and the Maintenance Teams, will have their offices at the St. John Parish Admin Building: 106 N 79th St, Seattle, with office hours from 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM.
- To ensure that all parishioners continue to feel supported as we gradually transition responsibilities to new staff members, Lori Corcoro will still be available for any concerns from St. Alphonsus Parish, Anita Hardwick for St. Benedict, and Mary Wiseman or the other staff for St. John. They will assist you and forward you to the concerned department or staff, if needed.

Faith Formation Team

- The Faith Formation staff of the three parishes are going to work together for the Parish Family. For example, Claire Shea, previously the Pastoral Assistant for Faith Formation of St. Alphonsus, will be expanding her role as the Evangelization Coordinator for Parish Family 14.
- This team, together with the Parochial Vicar and the Music Director (Andrew Koch), will have their offices at the St. Benedict Parish Center: 1805 N 49th St, Seattle.
- For questions about sacramental preparations and records, volunteering in liturgical ministries, and submitting mass intention requests, contact the team at 206-632-0843, lcorcoro@parishfamily14.org or visit St. Benedict Parish Center, with office hours from 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM.

New Parish Hubs

To make the best use of our available space and foster working relationships and collaboration among staff, we are organizing our operations into the following hubs and place the staff in the same location by department.

- **St. Alphonsus – Priest Hub:** The primary residence and coordination center for our clergy team. The St. Alphonsus Parish Office will be closed but Lori Corcoro is happy to continue assisting parishioners with scheduling facilities and is always ready to help during this transition.
- **St. Benedict – Faith Formation Hub:** The home base for all faith formation programs and ministry support.
- **St. John the Evangelist – Operations Hub:** The central location for administrative services, communications, finances, and facilities management.

Thank you for your prayers, patience, and support during this time of transition. Together, we are building a stronger, more vibrant Parish Family rooted in Christ.



FAITH IN FOCUS



Sunday Lay Prayer Leader

IN THE absence of a priest (and a deacon), communities of the faithful still gather on Sunday for prayer. Using the ritual *Sunday Celebrations in the*

Absence of a Priest, a well-trained and formed layperson may lead a celebration, which will not include Mass.

The absence of a priest (or deacon) may occur because of various circumstances. In some parts of the world, priests are so few that one only rarely visits a given community. In other places, a priest may serve several communities, permitting him to visit each only on rotation. Sudden illness or unforeseen obstacles may create emergencies in communities accustomed to a priest every Sunday. Many parishes train lay leaders of prayer for such occasions.

Sunday, the day of the Lord's Resurrection, is our primary day for community prayer. By gathering on Sunday, the faithful acclaim our belief in the resurrection, especially when we celebrate Eucharist.

When there is no priest (or deacon), the faithful still gather on Sunday for another form of prayer. Usually the liturgy includes several familiar elements. Introductory Rites form our community and prepare us for prayer. The Liturgy of the Word allows us to hear the Scriptures assigned for that Sunday's Mass. The lay leader offers a Prayer of Thanksgiving, in which we praise God. We may then share Holy Communion under the form of the Body of Christ, consecrated at a previous celebration of the Eucharist. Concluding Rites then send us on mission into the world.

Although this celebration can be a beautiful form of prayer, it should never decrease our desire for the Mass nor our awareness that the prolonged absence of the Eucharist cannot be tolerated. The Sunday lay leader who assists in this time of need deserves the community's prayerful respect.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati (Apr 6, 1901 - Jul 4, 1925)
Feast Day: July 4

Pier was born in Turin, Italy, in 1901. His mother was an artist and his father founded and ran the Italian newspaper *La Stampa*.

As he was growing up, Pier developed two habits that became part of his everyday life.

He went to Mass daily to receive the Eucharist, and he also prayed the Rosary. He never hesitated to share his faith with others.

Pier had a great concern for the poor, even as a child. One day a needy mother with a young son came to the Frassati home to beg for food. Pier noticed that the child was barefoot. He took off his own shoes and gave them to the boy, and then he and his mother fed the poor family. Pier used the money he got as a graduation gift to rent a room for a woman who had been evicted from her apartment because she had no money. He gave away his allowance to the poor, and sometime he chose to walk home from school because he gave the money for his bus or train fare to someone in need.

He joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society as a young man and spent hours on activities that helped the poor and sick. As a mining engineer, he cared deeply about the rights of the miners. He wanted them to have just working conditions and fair wages.

When he was 24, Pier became very ill with polio. Some people said he got this disease from caring for people in the slums of Turin, but Pier saw Jesus in the people he served. In his last days, he whispered the names of people who still needed assistance to his family and friends who gathered at his bedside. He died on July 4, 1925.

Peter was declared "Blessed" in 1990 by Pope John Paul II, who called him a "man of the Beatitudes" and a "joyful apostle of Christ." Many people were surprised that the Vatican created an official portrait of him for his beatification that showed him outdoors, leaning on an ice axe, with one foot on a rock, in honor of his youthful vitality and his love of the mountains.
