

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, DECEMBER 21 - Fourth Sunday of Advent

First Reading

The virgin shall be with child.

Isaiah 7:10-14

Twice today we hear the words Isaiah proclaimed hundreds of years before Christ's birth: "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel." This Hebrew name means "God is with us," and when Joseph, a devout and righteous man, is visited by an angel in his dream, he recalls Isaiah's prophecy. We know that God is also with us as we gather here to listen to God's word, and so at this time we allow ourselves to be immersed in God's presence as we actively listen to today's readings.

Baptism Promises Renewed

WHENEVER CATHOLICS celebrate Baptism at Mass, all the faithful renew their Baptismal promises. At the Easter Vigil, those about to be baptized must respond to questions asking them to renounce evil and to profess their faith. Having witnessed this, the rest of the community responds to the same questions, renewing their Baptismal promises.

Whenever infants are baptized, their parents and godparents renew their promises because an infant is incapable of making them. In this renewal, the parents and godparents demonstrate their willingness to share their faith with this growing child. When the Baptism takes place at Sunday Mass, all the faithful respond to the questions with the parents and godparents. This renewal replaces the Creed, but it also gives all members of the community a chance to pledge that they will share their faith with this child as well.

On Easter Sunday in the United States, the entire assembly renews its Baptismal promises, and this replaces the Creed on that day. The design of the Easter liturgy is that the renewal takes place at the Vigil right after Baptism. However, not everyone attends the Vigil, and it was thought important for all to make a renewal of promises at least once a year. Every Catholic should make an effort to attend the Vigil, when they will celebrate the Resurrection of Christ and witness the Baptisms. They will also be invited to renew their promises in the presence of those who have renounced sin and professed their faith in order to join the Body of Christ.

During Lent, Catholics accept penance to turn away from sin and follow the Gospel. When they renew their Baptismal promises at Easter, they bring their Lent to a fitting climax.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Francis Xavier

Feast Day: December 3

Canonized: March 12, 1622

Beatified: October 25, 1619

The Catholic Church calls Saint Francis Xavier “the Apostle to the Indies” and “the Apostle of Japan.” The word apostle means “one who is sent.” Jesus sent his twelve apostles out to announce the coming of God’s kingdom. Hundreds of years later, the Church sent Francis Xavier out to preach the same good news.

Francis was born in Spain in 1506. He studied in Paris and with Ignatius Loyola was one of the seven men who founded the Jesuit order, the Society of Jesus, in 1534. Then in 1541 he sailed to Goa, India. There he preached about Jesus—the poor carpenter of Nazareth.

Francis knew that actions speak louder than words, so he did not only tell the people of India the message of the Gospels. He acted out this message by living, sleeping, eating, playing, and working among the poor. Did they live in rickety huts? So did he. Did they eat only rice? So did he. Did they work long hours in the hot sun? So did he. Because of his words and actions, many thousands came to believe in the Christian God of mercy and love and tenderness.

In 1547, Francis sailed to Japan. In the two years he was there, he baptized thousands of people. But Francis had a dream. He wanted to take the good news to China. So in 1552 he set sail again. But he fell sick before reaching mainland China. On the island of Shangchuan, he died at the age of 46: far from home, but not far from God. He was canonized in 1622, at the same time as Ignatius of Loyola.

Francis Xavier is the patron saint of Catholic missionaries.


