To all who came to celebrate the birth of Christ at St. Stanislaus Kostka...

Throughout history, God's people have found the need to live their faith – and teach their faith – in a world which often opposed their efforts. Throughout history, God's people have tried to find a light in the midst of a dark and gloomy world, and they found it in their faith in God and in Jesus, his Son. This is why we speak of Jesus as "the light of the world" and why the prophets, especially Isaiah, remind us that we need to find, and then be, that light in a world that tries to make it hard to see.

The gold cross on our newly refinished front doors is meant to remind us of that fact every time that we enter our Church; the light in the midst of the darkness can be found in this church and in our gathering together when we enter through the cross of Jesus. At the same time, when we walk out through that same cross, we have been challenged to be that light for others. In this way, we are doing our part to fulfill the promise which St. John proclaimed in his Gospel: "the light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it." Today, it is up to you and me to make this happen.

St. Stan's has had a long, and proud, history of doing this by the efforts of those who "reach out" to others with sacrifices of their time and their talents. This yearly special Christmas bulletin is put together for two reasons: first, to show how many things have been done as a light for people in need, and secondly in the hope that those who read this will find something that they would like to do to share their time and talents with others and be a light in their darkened world. We hope that next year, when you read this bulletin again, you will "see" your efforts on these pages and know that you have helped make our light shine a bit more brightly.

We all know quite well that the last few years have been a troubling time for our Church and our people, as well as for our nation, our families and our traditions. While it is normal to not want to "get involved" this is really not an option for God's people. Being angry or upset with what is happening will not make things better. We must *do* something if change is to take place. It is easy to "curse the darkness" but, as the founder of the group called *The Christophers* used to preach: "It is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness." The miracle of Christmas challenges us to be that light. We can, at the very least, pray for our world and our Church, but that prayer will be more effective if we pray it in the light of Christ. On this blessed day, can't each of us find some time to first pray that the light of God's truth will shine in – and through – each of us and bring change to our world and, secondly, be a part of the answer to our own prayer by the lives we lead? How appropriate that would be for this holy season.

May the light that led the magi to Bethlehem... the light that has brought us here today and encouraged us to read these words... the light that lights our path as we leave this gathering and return to our homes... the light that lit the skies on that first Christmas... may THAT light become the light that each of us brings to someone else, today... and every day... AMEN.

2019 WAS A YEAR OF SERVICE FOR OUR PARISH OF ST. STANISLAUS KOSTKA:

- *Our Parish Council works hard to serve our community and is comprised of committees that work to enhance parish life, such as Liturgy, Social, Outreach, Finance, Education, and Buildings and Grounds
- *Once a month a group of retired parishioners gather and assemble over 100 sandwiches and large trays of pasta to be taken to the LunchBox in the City of Poughkeepsie.
- *These same individuals host a Mass followed by a hot luncheon for 30 disabled Catholics from all over Dutchess on the First Saturday of February.
- *Once a month a group of teens prepare dinner and serve 60+ at the local Homeless Shelter.
- *30 parishioners volunteer once a month at the Pleasant Valley Ecumenical Food Pantry
- *Many parishioners donate food which is delivered to the Pantry on a weekly basis
- *Over \$2500 was collected through the generosity of our parish families and donated to Good Counsel Home for unwed mothers via the annual Baby Bottle Coin Collection in October.
- *Each October St. Stanislaus participates in the Dutchess Outreach Coat Drive, collecting an exceptional number of winter coats for those in need in Dutchess County.
- *Each week 7-10 parishioners volunteer for two hours at the Lutheran Care Center.
 - They transport residents from their units to the Chapel and assist Father as he celebrates Mass Annually, many parishioners donate gift items to the residents for their Christmas party
- *The Prayer Shawl Ministry, dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe, comprised of 12-15 ladies (and one man) knit and crochet shawls and lap blankets for those needing to be "wrapped in our Lady's mantle of love."
- Last year over 40 shawls and blankets were given for comfort. Never hesitate to call for someone you may feel would benefit from one. They are remarkably beautiful and truly made with prayer and love.
- *Members of our Garden Club faithfully share their time and talent in beautifying our parish campus. **We NEED more help.** If you are talented in this way give a call to help us plan for Spring!
- *A group of faithful parishioners decorates the church for each season, especially Easter and Christmas
- *Our Social Committee offers monthly coffee and refreshments after the 11am Mass, held an Ice Cream Social in October, and organized the annual Pot-Luck Supper in November in celebration of our feast day
- *The Senior citizens enjoy an annual Advent Breakfast and work together on service projects
- *Approximately 70 men are members of the St. Stanislaus Chapter of the Knights of Columbus. Some of their activities include:
 - Sponsoring a Mardi Gras Dinner Dance just before Lent
 - Fish Fry's every Friday during Lent and Annual Palm Sunday breakfast
 - Pig Roast and Golf Outing fundraisers for Teens club's pilgrimage to March for Life
 - Sponsoring Blood Drives twice a year
 - Assisting with Faith Formation, Family Catechesis, and Vacation Bible School
 - Repairing and setting up the large outdoor Nativity and indoor tree
 - Sponsoring an annual scholarship to a graduating senior
 - Sponsoring scholarships for parish youth to attend retreats
 - Supporting vocations both in our parish as well as on a diocesan level
- *Our PTAF (Pallottine Teenage Federation) Teen Club has 35 members and 5 adult volunteers. They participate in many service projects that support our parish and community.
 - Provide Sandwiches and other donation or food and clothing
 - Annual Souper-bowl Sunday collection for The Dutchess Coalition for the Homeless
 - Attend the annual March for Life in Washington, DC.
