



WILL YOU HELP LEAD OUR PARISH OUT OF COVID AND INTO THE FUTURE?

It seems that no one can predict when Covid 19 will finally be over? But that does not mean that we can't have a plan in place and ready to go for when it finally does end. At St. Stanislaus Kostka, we believe that this must include a way to bring people back and a way to help them grow in their relationship with God and his Church.

It is our belief that a way to accomplish this can be with our weekly gatherings at Mass and by providing a Liturgy that strengthens our personal relationship with God by strengthening our own spiritual growth and renewing our desire to be a part of his plan for renewal.

As we look to the future, we would like to infuse some "new blood" into some groups which have been faithful throughout the pandemic, but would truly appreciate having some of their depleted numbers built up again. These groups include, but are not limited to, our *Altar Servers*...

Lectors...Music Groups...Ushers...Religious Ed teachers and helpers...Volunteers at Lutheran Care...and Volunteers to sell Grocery Cards after Mass. Here is what we would like to do:

- --invite those who have not yet returned to "active service" to do so now
- --ask for new volunteers in all of the above ministries
- --let us know that you would like to help by calling the Office before June 19th
- --join us for a series of informational gatherings the week of June 26
- --be ready to start as soon as possible or once school starts up again in September

The only ministry that has an "age requirement" is that those wishing to be Altar Servers should be at least entering the 5th Grade in September but there is no "you are too old" limit. (We could even start an "Over the Hill" group of Adults trained for certain events or Masses!) The whole idea is that we want to get away from the notion that tells us "but that's not the way we used to do things." One other "requirement" is that Volunteers for Lutheran Care would have to be available on Wednesday afternoons from about 1:30PM to 3:00PM. Please pray over your decision and give us a call as soon as you can. You are really needed.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT...

"No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord', except in the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service, but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

How special was the day of Pentecost then, but even more special today. As Paul speaks of what is happening around us. The gifts, the service. The Spirit is at work today. Take a minute to realize the gifts that your best friend has. Where did they come from? Do you affirm them for their gift? Who seems to render great service in the community, at church, home visits, a friendly telephone call? When did you thank them for what they do? Where is the Spirit at work in the parish, school, on the job? We are asked to think about the manifestation of the Spirit in our lives.

We now move to a final consideration. St. Paul tells us that the gifts are given and present in everyone for some benefit. The gift you have received perhaps is asleep in your life. May the noise, wind and fire of Pentecost awaken all of us.

A LOOK AHEAD: READINGS FOR JUNE 12, 2022

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

God created Wisdom before he created the earth or the skies. This spirit stood beside God every day until the earth was complete, then "found delight in the people of the earth." This indicates that the spirit of wisdom was later personified by Jesus.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Paul says that we are now at peace with God through our faith in Jesus. We also hope to see the glory of God. This hope will not leave us disappointed because of the love God has shown in sending us the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Jesus tells the disciples that when he leaves them, a Spirit will help guide them to the truth. This Spirit will announce what he hears from Jesus, rather than speaking on his own. Everything God has also belongs to Jesus, which is why those things announced by the Spirit will actually come from Jesus.
